GRANT HALL OPENED

A Great Assemblage Present at the Ceremonies - Chancellor, Sir Sandford Fleming, Accepted the Gift - Addresses Delivered - Rev. Prof. Macnaughton's Inaugural.

In presence of an assemblage numbering 1,700 people, the Convocation Hall, erected at Queen's to the memory of the late illustrious Principal Grant, was formally opened...

At the installation of Principal Grant on December 30, 1877, the Rev. Daniel M. Gordon acted as chaplain. It is a matter of no ordinary interest that his life-long friend is here to-day.

The Building Represented. Vice-president W. H. Lavell, of the Alma Mater Society, spoke next, on behalf of the student body of Queen's, handing over Grant Hall to the university.

History of the Movement. Rev. James Wallace, M.A., B.D., Lindsay, was the first speaker. He presented the students and graduates of Queen's and as their representative formally handed over to the university authorities, Grant Hall, which was built by the subscriptions offered by the students and graduates of the college.

This gift was a matter of great pride to the late Principal Grant and it showed that the college was not without honor in its own country. It was further decided to call on the county of Frontenac for \$20,000 to erect the much needed hall to be known as Frontenac Hall.

Prof. John Macnaughton. The aged chancellor was loudly applauded when he formally received the building on behalf of the university. He delivered the following forcible and touching address:

The Chancellor's Address. "In the name and on behalf of this university, I gratefully and proudly accept your gift. This gathering of the sons of Queen's, the first convoked within these newly raised walls, is indeed a memorable occasion.

My duty to-day is to receive for the university a standing tribute of the deep affection professed by one who endeared himself to them, and to declare the Grant hall open and ready for the purpose of its erection. In doing so I wish to give expression to the gratitude and affection of the grateful thanks of Queen's University. I have likewise a personal source of gratitude to you. There is no engagement in which I could be called upon to take part which would awaken in my mind so many and so varied and interesting recollections as this memorial occasion. I desire, therefore, to add my sincere thanks to the donors of the gift for the privilege I now enjoy.

blood of the late principal. He felt that the proceedings were to consummate the rearing of a monument to Principal Grant, who had taken great pride in the erection of the hall.

"I shall not dwell on the feeling of deep bereavement which followed and which all experienced. I shall remember only the thankfulness that he lived and that from his first day in Kingston to the end he lavishly gave himself to advance this university, to enlighten the students and to promote every good and patriotic cause.

Principal Gordon's Address. Principal Gordon next spoke representing the university council. In opening he announced that Hon. W. Harty, who had been invited to speak on behalf of subscribers, felt physical

incapable of doing so. The speaker said that he looked upon the opening of Grant Hall as the commencement of a new epoch in the history of Queen's. The sons of Queen's have caught, in no small degree, the spirit of the man whose name the hall bears.

The speaker referred to the charge against Queen's of being denominational as a "dead head" thing. "The church with which Queen's has the honor of being associated is the least sectarian of churches. It is better, he said, to have the old true-blue Presbyterian color than to have no color at all.

Description of The Hall. On plan, Grant Hall is a parallelogram, about fifty feet by seventy-five feet, with a seating capacity of 700 persons. This auditorium is surrounded on three sides with a wide aisle or ambulatory, over which are the galleries, the latter with a seating capacity of 550. The ambulatory will afford further accommodation for 200 persons, but is especially set apart for memorial purposes, its walls being designed for tablets, portraits and other mementoes of the life of the university and of Canada.

The hall has been designed in the later Romanesque period, conforming to the general character of the surrounding buildings, but richer detail and more character has been brought into the work, as the opportunity and was afforded. A campanile rises at the south west corner of the group, to a height of over 100 feet, forming also the main or University avenue entrance. It is the intention to further mark this portion of the memorial by a handsome wrought iron clock, to be made by the students under the instructions of Prof. Dupuis. This will prove a very useful as well as ornamental gift, as the tower dominates all the buildings on the campus. The entire exterior work has been executed with local stone, and fully illustrates that it can be put to good construction as well as ornamental uses, the carving over the main entrance doors - the volutes and workmanship executed in any stone.
