FRAUD UPON FARMER. Pays Northern New York Farmers

In Bogus Checks. Syracuse, N.Y., Dec. 8 .- Upon the statement of Simon Bummer, of Schenectady, who is under arrest here charged with grand larceny, Chief of Police Wright claims to have evidence of a gigantic swindle involving hundreds of thousands of dollars. Brummer has, so the chief says, laid bare a scheme for defrauding farmers which netted its originators large sums of money. The company bought farm produce, giving in payment worthless cheques, and its operations cover a period of several months.


