Walkem framed a by-law, hich, if it had carried, would have made it almost impossible for the suditor to ever be dismissed. The difference of the present grit by-law, as t has been called, differs very much from the proposed tory one of a year ago. The vital difference will be seen in clause one of each by-law as given clow. The tory by-law proposed to make the auditor's position absolutely secure by providing that his dismissal must be carried out only by two-thirds vote of council. The liberal by-law allows him to be removed at the pleasure of the council, or by a simple majority. All to which is the better by-law, the people can judge for themselves.
