

CARING FOR LONDON'S POOR Work Provided But Pay Goes To

London has problems in connection with the unemployed in her east end the gravity of which exceed any of those with which organized charity in this country has had to grapple. In this connection an interesting experiment has been successfully carried through in the administration of a "Mansion House Fund" in avoiding the evils usually attending the giving of relief in time of industrial and commercial depression. In consequence of exceptional distress in the winter of 1903-4 relief works were organized, but in order to reach the deserving class of the unemployed a new me-thod was adopted. An offer was made of continuous work at reclamation of waste land, etc., in colonies outside the city, to male heads of families with settled homes in London. The men were boarded and lodged at the colonies, but received nothing to sper the relief money going to the familie at home, being proportioned to the number of children. As far as possible preference was given to those who could bring employers' references, and the record of the relief colonies showed that the men who belonged to this class possessed far greater powers of perseverance than the lower grade of "casual" laborer. As a whole the scheme was found to eliminate idlers and habitual dependents; it produced a marked improvement in physique of the men who worked, and insured continuity and thoroughness of relief. Plans are already under way to utilize the principle in other dis-
