Eisenburg, Pa., Dec. 20.—Lewis Mackintosh, of Portage, Pa., was sentenced to serve one year and four months in the Western Penitentiary by the Cambria county court for having been implicated in an attempt to hold up a Pennsylvania railroad fast line express near Portage six weeks ago.
