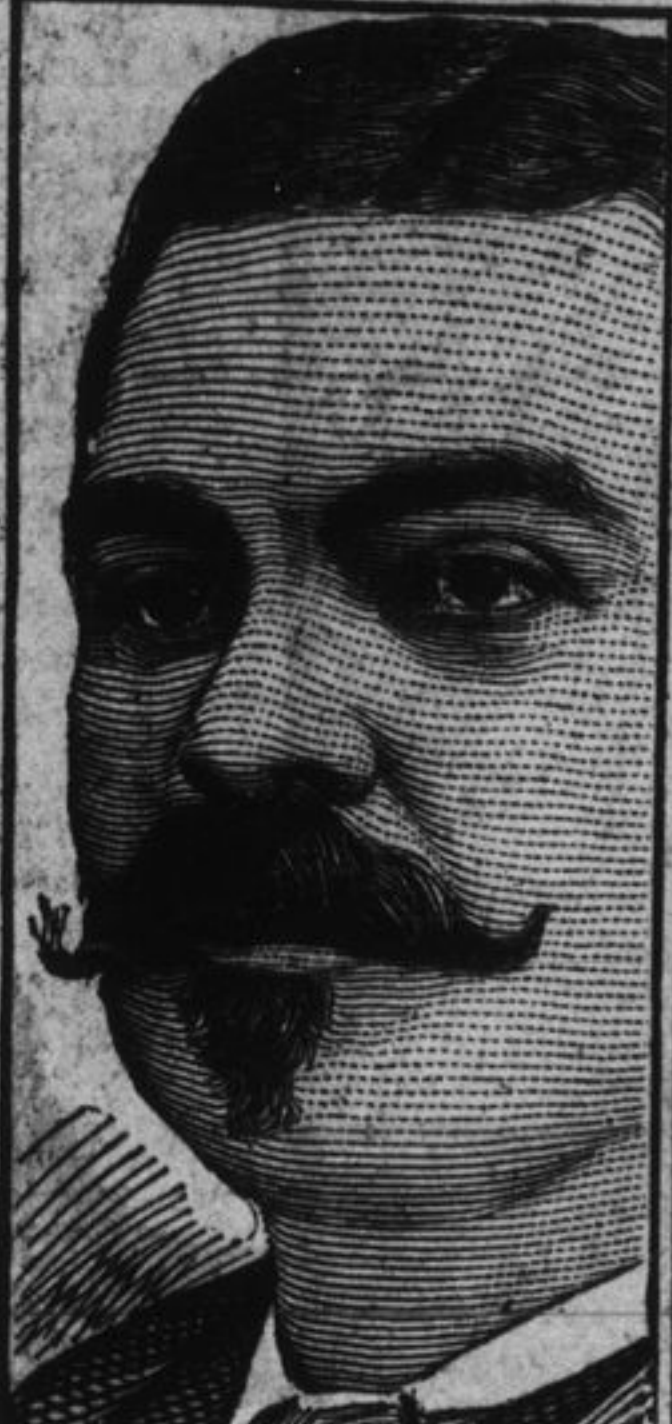

ALL THE BARS MAY REMAIN OPEN ON MUNICIPAL ELECTION DAY

Special to the Whig.—In regard to the case at Galt, yesterday, in which an hotel-keeper was prosecuted for keeping his bar open on municipal election day, Eudo Saunders, chief officer of the Ontario license department, said, this morning, that the contention of James Haveron, K.C., counsel for the defendant, that there was nothing in the statute to prevent the opening of bars on municipal election day, so long as no spirituous liquors are sold, was correct, but he pointed out that the provisions of the Ontario election act were far more sweeping, and that hotels could not be opened on provincial election day.
