Proud of Belonging To The Firm Of John Bull—Our Tremendous Vitality—Weight In Dollars. Jack Canuck is the grown-up son in the firm of John Bull and Sons.

Jack is proud of belonging to the firm of John Bull, but he wants John Bull to stop his social dinner-party gallivanting with his rival Jonathan.

But behind the touchiness of the Canadian—who, when he asks your opinion of the Dominion, means he wants praise, and sports that you ought to have stayed at home if you criticise, who, being ignorant of other countries, and especially of England, is cock-sure that the old country is out-of-date—there is a tremendous virility. He works. You do not see in Canada such poverty as you have at home; but rather do you find in Canada the culture and the refinement you have at home.

Canada is moving much quicker towards Imperial Federation than Canada's critics realize. The Dominion from a little and swaddled colony into a brawny and ambitious nation is worth thought by my countrymen at home. In the United Kingdom are 344 persons to the square mile; in Canada the average is 1 1/2 to the square mile.

Canada likes to weigh herself with dollars in the other's scale. "Take agriculture, and reduce everything to dollars. I take the facts from the census returns of 1901: The value of the land was put down at \$1,007,424,304; buildings, \$395,213,435; implements and machinery, \$108,665,502; horses, \$118,279,419; milch cows, \$69,237,970; other horned cattle, \$54,107,341; sheep, \$10,490,594; swine, \$19,445,703; field crops, \$194,935,420; fruits and vegetables, \$12,994,900; nursery stock sold, \$49,501; live stock sold, \$52,755,375; meats and products of animals killed on the farm, \$22,961,527; dairy products, \$66,470,953; wool, \$1,887,064; eggs, \$10,286,929; honey and wax, \$356,816; maple sugar and syrup, \$1,780,482.

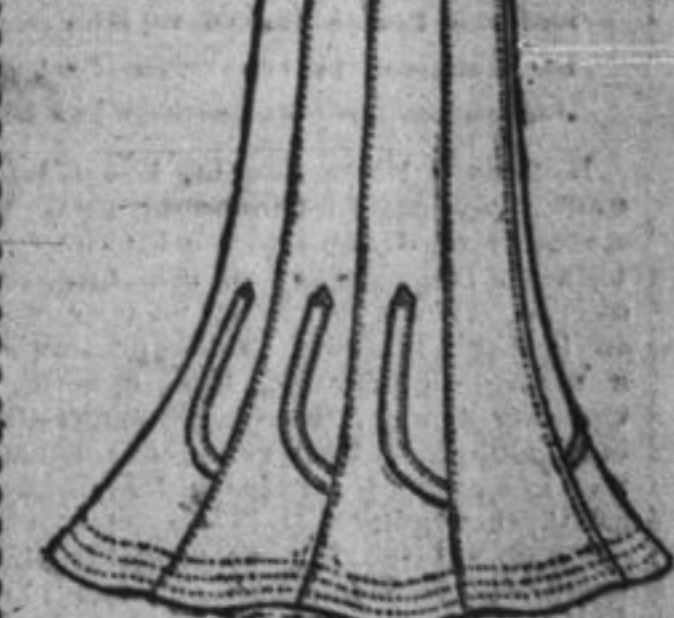
