Public School Inspector Kidd's December report to the Board of Education contains the following items:
The total number of pupils in attendance was 2,100, a decrease of thirty from last year. The average daily attendance during 1901, was 1841, a decrease of ten from corresponding month last year. In the kindergartens, 193 pupils were enrolled, the average daily attendance being 144. There were seven new pupils admitted to the schools. There were two cases of truancy and three suspensions. Teachers were absent on account of illness; thirteen days. 


