CHURCH WORK.

What is Going On Among Denominations.

Rev. C. W. Westman, curate of the Ascension, Windsor, has received a call to Toronto.

Rev. W. Tindal-Lorymer has resigned his pastorate of the Baptist church at Stuyvesant, Que.

Rev. A. T. Love, pastor of St. Andrew's church, Quebec, was presented with a fur coat, cap and gloves all for a little less than a year, has resigned.

Rev. H. C. Kennedy, pastor of the Baptist church at Safford, Ont., has sent in his resignation, which will take effect April 1st.

Rev. Dr. E. J. Wolf, president of the general synod of the Lutheran church of America, died at Gettysburg, aged sixty-five years.

Rev. Charles Mockridge, rector of St. Philip's church, Detroit, has accepted the recently tendered call to the pulpit of St. John's Protestant Episcopal church, Roxbury, Mass.

The Reformist Episcopal church at Sussex, N.B., has extended a call to Rev. W. J. Gilliland, Philadelphia, in succession to Rev. A. M. Hubley, who goes to Belleville, Ont. this month.

Bishop Macdonell, of Alexandria, has appointed Rev. Father A. J. McMillan parish priest of the Church of the Nativity, East Cornwall, as successor to Rev. Father Leaky, who has resigned on account of ill-health.

As the result of fourteen years' missionary ministry, by the American Missionary Association in Northern Alaska, there is now at the Cape a practically transformed community.
