If the charge was true, then the demand for the defeat of the government would be just. But the charge is not true. The finger of the critic cannot touch a spot of corruption in the government's record. Year after year, the committee on public accounts, and the legislature in session, have reviewed the balance sheets of the province, and no defalcation has been found. The election courts have held innumerable trials, and not a scrap of reliable evidence has implicated a cabinet minister. is nothing new. There always have been men anxious to keep a party in power, and others equally anxious to put a party in power, for their own personal gain; they will spend their own money to do it, because they hope to gain something; they will sin for it because they hope to profit by it. And there are just as many of these men working for one party as for the other.

But the government has never endorsed these men. It has never passed laws for their punishment; it has facilitated the work of the courts for their trial and sentence. The liberal government and the liberal party alike have condemned a political wrong-doing, whether among its supporters or its opponents. In that it stands alone, search the reports of Mr. Whitney's speeches, search the columns of conservative papers, and you will find in vain for a word of condemnation of the men on the conservative side who have done wrong.

Both parties have had criminals operating ostensibly for the benefit of their party, but really for their own benefit. The liberals condemn these men, the conservatives do not. Let Mr. Whitney have the audacity to ask people of Ontario to turn out of office the men who are opposed to wrong-doing in their ranks, and put in men who have not a word to say against their own criminals.

There ought not to be much doubt as to what decision an intelligent elector will give on Wednesday. None is there much doubt. From all parts of the country come the most cheering reports. In every constituency supporters of the government are working with an enthusiasm unprecedented. The policy of slander indulged in by Mr. Whitney and his friends is proving a boomerang. The people are not prepared to apply the vilest epithets in the language to the men who have had the confidence and respect of the community; and the friends of these men are righteously indignant at the policy of slander indulged against their leaders. They are rallying to the support of Mr. Ross with unbounded enthusiasm, and they are warmly welcomed by hosts of non-partisans, and are not a few disgust of conservatives.

Here and there a former liberal has joined the ranks of the opposition. In nearly every constituency there is a man who wanted something and did not get it. The defection of these few is more than counterbalanced by the accession of conservatives who propose to place country and party aside, and to vote for the men who have done something, rather than for the men who can only talk and talk very foolishly at that.
