LIGHT QUESTION AGAIN. The election has precluded from the people's consideration much that ordinarily occupies their attention.

The bills of the last quarter have been generally high. They have occasioned much complaint and the circumstance is to be regretted. It comes at an inopportune time, when the council has under its consideration important improvements in connection with the electric light and gas works.

Perhaps the people have been somewhat impatient of results. And yet there is some reason for their discontent. They recall the fact that when there was an agitation for the acquisition of the plants the idea was entertained that under municipal government there would be a better and a cheaper service.

REVOLT IN RUSSIA. No event in connection with the war has stirred the Russian people and stirred the world as the terrible slaughter in St. Petersburg.

The occasion was free from all that would suggest this inhumanity. The workmen, affected by great strikes and suffering through their families, their wives and children desired to petition his imperial majesty.

There may be a suspicion that danger lurked within the ranks of the demonstrating workmen. The nihilists, the enemies of the monarch, and the disturbing element which no longer in the hands of constituted authority has been able to extirpate.

The Independent Telephone Company is seeking a franchise in Winnipeg, and finds the usual difficulties. Until the government assumes the long-suffering lines of the Bell company opposition in the telephone business must be limited.

The Fall River cotton mill strike is over for the present, pending an inquiry by Gov. Donaghy. But \$1,000,000 has been lost in wages, and the business has been permanently ruined.

Edward J. Scario, a carpenter, who married the widow of late Mark Hopkins, and inherited \$90,000,000 through her death, has given Methuen, Mass., a \$500,000 public library and a \$1,000,000 high school.

GRIPPING ACROSS THE WAY

The contention of Leslie's Weekly, that municipal officers are often detected in crime, but never punished, substantially challenges comment. It is a statement of fact. In Minneapolis, New York, Buffalo, St. Louis, Pittsburgh, Memphis, Detroit, Philadelphia, and elsewhere, men have been caught in acts of malfeasance and official corruption, and the machinery of the courts has been put in operation against them, but without good results.
