Napanee, Jan. 27. - The death occurred, on Tuesday last, of Benjamin C. Lloyd, an old and much respected resident of Napanee, in the seventy-third year of his age. Deceased has been ailing for the past few months and death was not unexpected. A widow and one daughter, Mrs. A. W. Linton, are left to mourn a loving husband and father. The funeral took place, Thursday, to the Eastern cemetery vault. Deceased was a man of kindly disposition and a life-long member of the Methodist church. He spent his early years on a farm near Strathcona and a couple of years ago removed to Napanee to spend his declining years.

James Gordon, in the seventy-third year of his age, died on Tuesday last, of a heart ailment. He was a native of Scotland and had resided in Napanee for many years. He was a member of the Methodist church and was a very kind and generous man. He is survived by a wife and several children.

Pirate's Skin Sold By Auction.

London, Jan. 24. - A piece of the skin of a Danish pirate, slightly larger than a shilling, was sold recently to Major Ind for three guineas at Stevens' auction rooms. A lock of King Edward IV's hair, which was taken from his tomb at Windsor when it was opened in 1789, did not find a purchaser, however.

The village was caught and executed while pillaging Hadstock church, in Essex, over 900 years ago, and his skin was nailed to the church door as a warning to other evil-doers. The relic, which looks like a jagged piece of thick parchment, became lodged in the hinge of the massive old door, where it was discovered in 1855.

EMPEROR'S BIRTHDAY.

The Kaiser Congratulated On Being Forty-six.

Berlin, Jan. 27. - All Germany united today in paying honor to Emperor William on the occasion of his forty-sixth birthday. Military reviews were held in all the chief cities of the empire, and in churches of all denominations there were special thanksgiving services this morning. In the capital the banks and exchanges, offices and shops were closed, the streets decorated with flags and bunting and crowded with people.

During the course of the morning Emperor William and the imperial family attended service in the chapel of the castle. Later in the day the emperor received congratulations presented by all of the members of the diplomatic corps, including Ambassador Tower. Great plans have been made for the court reception this evening.

Emperor William has now been on the throne seventeen years and the strenuous life is beginning to tell on him. During the last year or two his hair has become streaked with gray and his face shows the imprint of the "crow's feet." Those acquainted with the everyday life of the emperor are not surprised that he is beginning to show traces of age, but not so much to advancing years as to his abnormal activity of mind and body. In addition to the cares of state, which are sufficient in themselves to bring the average mortal to an early grave, there appears to be absolutely nothing great or small that does not engage the attention of his imperial highness. When not engaged with the great problems of state he finds time to design warships, paint pictures, write books, criticize plays and music and attend to the most minute details relating to the army, navy, the commercial and industrial affairs of the empire.

Withal, he finds time to pay the most devoted attention to his large and interesting family. As "Papa de famille," the emperor is something quite different from his public self. True, he remains the autocrat there, but while he is rather severe with his children and never allows disobedience to go unpunished, even in the case of the crown prince, who has attained his majority, he lets all of them have their full measure of fun, sportiveness. Those best acquainted with the home life of the emperor declare that he is as devoted to the empress as when he led her to the altar. The imperial couple will celebrate their twenty-fifth wedding anniversary next year, and it will be made the occasion for grand festivities throughout the empire. The emperor is believed by everybody who knows him, and those his own voice as to her excellent qualities as a mother and a wife. Even the most rabid socialist has never been known to accord her aught but praise.

Deeds Not Words.

Makes Wool Without Sheep.

London, Jan. 27. - A new and valuable use has been found for the banks of slag that made certain districts of Tenside hideous from the windows of a railway carriage. By means of a patent process it is proposed to convert the unsightly heaps into a substance resembling wool. The process by which it is achieved is that of running molten slag into a cupola, tapping the cupola, and blowing the melted slag through a fine wire screen. It comes out in a long, wavy, woolly fiber, which, to the eye and touch, is hardly distinguishable from sheep's wool.

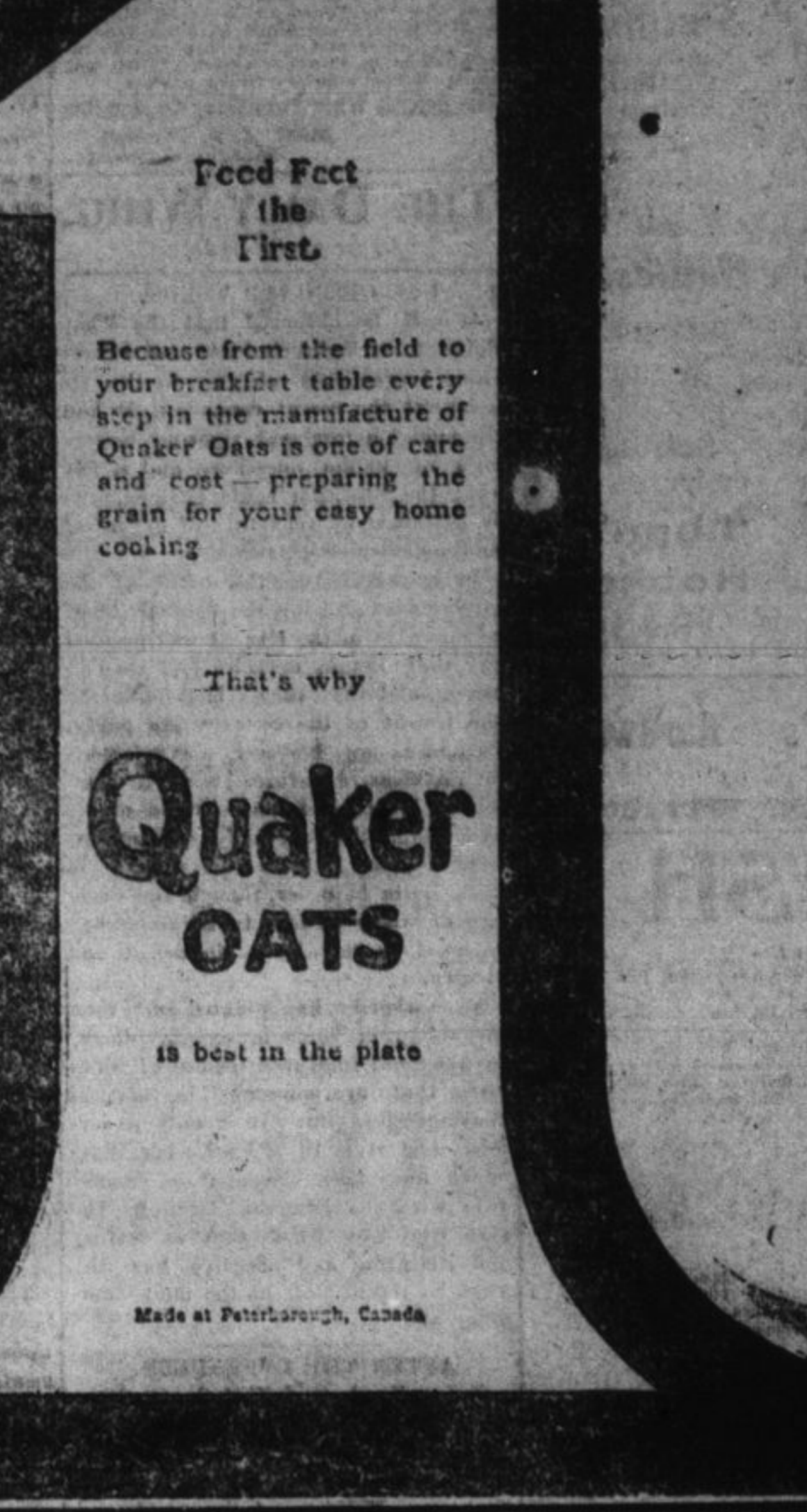
