STILL FIGHT.

Great Battle Again Raging On Sha River.

BALTIC FLEET

REPORTED BADLY DAMAGED BY HURRICANE.

Censorship Allows Printing Of Paris Despatch To the Effect That Kuropatkin Has Opened Negotiations With Oyama.

St. Petersburg, Jan. 28.—Gen. Kuropatkin, under date of January 25th, telegraphs as follows: The Russians occupied Khaliatinsk without firing, the Japanese being bayoneted. Khegoutou was captured, but was finally occupied at twelve o'clock at night. The Russian cavalry pursued two regiments of Japanese Dragoons, which fled southward. On the Russian left flank a detachment repulsed the Japanese, and occupied a village near Khadiensan and Esman. An English despatch sent against the enemy's flank near Lindechek forced the Japanese to withdraw, and captured two hundred cattle. The Russians, Gen. Kuropatkin added, also occupied the village of Weherata on the Hun river, losing fifty men, and on the same day occupied the village of Shakhke and repulsed the Japanese to retake these. Gen. Kuropatkin is to take later despatches, reports that Russian troops, which were strongly fortified by the Japanese, were easily repelled. The Japanese advanced a little, and Gen. Kuropatkin's success seems to have nicely arranged the tables upon the Japanese. Evidently Gen. Kuropatkin is following up his victory.

The latest despatches from the front, dated on the evening of January 28th, indicate that a battle is in progress, extending along the centre, and becoming more and more serious.

A Black Star Loses Heavily.

Rome, Jan. 28.—An undated telegram from the headquarters of Gen. Kuropatki, who commands the right wing of the Japanese army, says that the Japanese have driven back the Russians who crossed the Hun river, and have captured four field guns.
