HUN RIVER Fight Assumes Proportions Of A Battle. LARGE FORCES ARE BEING PITTED AGAINST EACH OTHER. Kuropatkin Began Battle With Army Of 60,000—Capture Of Village Cost Over 1,000 Lives No Word From Russian Correspondents. Tokyo, Jan. 30.—The fighting along the Hun River has reached the proportions of a battle. Already 1,000 Russian wounded have arrived at Mukden, and the hospitals at Harbin have been placed in readiness for thousands more. The Russians admit that their capture of the village of Sandepu cost them forty-five officers and 1,000 men killed and wounded. Official Japanese despatches declare that Gen. Kuropatkin began the battle. Dymna reports that Kuropatkin attacked with more than an army corps (60,000 men). The Japanese field marshal asserts that he repulsed a division of the enemy 30,000 men, at Chentai, and that the Russians retreated, in direction of the left wing. A Japanese detachment was victorious at Chen Jiehphas, and occupied Linstai and Lichiwopung on Saturday, the Russians retreating north and west. The Japanese, with infantry, occupied positions south-east of Helkantai, on Saturday, and are assaulting the main position. Another detachment dislodged a regiment of infantry, a brigade of cavalry, and twelve guns occupying Haehho, five miles south of Nekoiat. The enemy retreated to the right bank of the Hun river with the Japanese pursuing them. The Japanese captured 500 rifles and many other arms. The Russians are massing about 65,000 troops on the Japanese left, and bombarding the left bank of the river. Some forces of Russians are attacking all along the line. Mukden despatches indicate a Japanese repulse in an attempt to capture Lone Tree Hill. A Great Disaster. London, Jan. 30.—A despatch to the Chronicle, from St. Petersburg, says it is vaguely reported that a great disaster has befallen Gen. Kuropatkin's right wing. Compelled To Retire. St. Petersburg, Jan. 30.—Instead of confirmation of Saturday night's report that Gen. Kurok's headquarters, Jan. 29, Panasi, Jan. 30.—The Russian attempt to turn the Japanese left has resulted in a complete failure. The Russians chose the worst weather of the season, depending, perhaps, upon their familiarity with a snowy country to aid in their preparations. Their artillery attacks on the Japanese permanent line it is thought, was a demonstration to prevent the withdrawal of forces for the purpose of reinforcing the Japanese left. All yesterday afternoon and into the night, an artillery duel was waged across the Shakho river. It has been quiet, to-day, except on the left. MEASURES PASSED. Opposed To The Railroadings Of The Acts. Winnipeg, Jan. 30.—The bill introduced by the government to guarantee Canadian Northern bonds for 187 miles of new road within the province, at \$10,000 a mile, was put through three readings at Saturday's session of the legislature, while another bill to guarantee the bonds of the same company, to the extent of \$1,000,000 for new terminals at Winnipeg passed its first and second readings and the committee stage. The opposition leader, Mr. McKillop, protested against the railroadings through the house of measures involving a capital sum of \$3,000,000, but Premier Kiffin said that the legislation was necessary in order to allow of house proceeding on Tuesday of this week. Hon. S. H. Blake, in a speech in response to the toast "Canada," at Wycliffe College dinner, said no effort should be spared to weld Newfoundland to the dominion.
