Letter From Greater New York.

IN OLD TIMES

THE WAY THE SALVATION ARMY BEGAN ITS WORK.

Has Modified His Views Of The Herald Of Salvation—Charity Unable To Meet This Writer's Demands.

(Special Correspondence, Letter 1446.)
New York, Feb. 10.—"By their fruits ye shall know them." "The stone which the builders rejected has become the head of the corner." Nearly three decades have past, since walking up Broadway, I encountered a little crowd between thirty and forty people; two thirds of the body were women who were dressed substantially in plain blue batiste gray skirts and old-fashioned poke bonnets, whose hair was frayed back like the wreath of an old blue gingham shawl. The women were young, strong and healthy, and each one carried a tambourine or a pair of cymbals and there were rather a disreputable looking set, and in the crowd there was any scale of voices from a puny whistle to a bassoon. One of the women seemed to have a separate war cry. "Hallelujah! Marry," and Praise the Lord Janetie," led the way in the comedy song of praise. They sang as if they enjoyed it more than the hymns. "Sing Barley, Jimmie," turned handicapped, the hymn portion of the worship wound up with a buck somersault upon the pavement, and with a broad grin he looked up upon the crowd for his merited applause, as much as to say, "How many angels could do that?" I was amazed; I had travelled in many lands. I had attended camp meetings made up of whites and blacks, half way from the equator to the Arctic or Antarctic pole; I had seen many queer numbers of weirdness to the sole representative of sanity and truth that I had never seen anything like this before in all my life. "What is this?" I inquired of a gentleman who stood near me. "Why, don't you know?" he answered, "this is the delegation of the Salvation Army; they have come to the United States to convert the great American people, and instead of beginning up among the sinners they will commence their work down among the saints. Their work will be special among those whom the priest has passed by. They are sent to work among those, apparently, by God and man forsaken; they fear no contamination when a sinner touches the hem of their garments; they go down into the slums, where starvation starves poverty in the face, where the name of God is only heard connected with horrid blasphemy, among a race where the hope of heaven and the fear of hell are like the sounding brass and the tinkling cymbal." For a moment I was silent. I asked myself this solemn question: "Is it possible that those who practice the antics of this unsavory crowd can believe that such a form of worship will be grateful to the Almighty?"

Many years have passed since then, I have grown older, I won't say wise, or, but I have learned to modify my first opinion of those rude gospel messengers who came as the heralds of salvation with faith of hope and charity.

The frozen spell which has raged over thousands of miles, comes to us crushed and weighted down with shocking tales of misery and suffering, too horrid to think of. During this Arctic wave our harbors have been tied up, causing more suffering than the terrible blizzard of 1888, which then represented the zero of misery; in this great city, with its thin millions of inhabitants, we have many grand charitable institutions, piloted alike by Dr. Leonhardt, many who belong to neither class, the foundation of whose belief is the "Brotherhood of man and the Fatherhood of God"; but, with the best endeavor of the great body of these charitable associations, they have found themselves unable to meet entirely and fully the demands upon their charity and capacity to give, in the most costly part of the city of New York, where each foot of land has to be covetously filled with golden ingots if you want to buy a tenth of a plot here; or, on Fourteenth street, right among the busiest mart's of trade and almost in the midst of those grand combination stores where the wealth of the world may be seen in dazzling splendor, is the central home of the great Salvation Army. Great, did I say?—I should greatly err in saying that the leaders are dedicated to the beatitude which is the greatest of them all, charity—a charity which is as boundless as the

sky.

The storm cloud which has been hanging over Russia for the last few weeks seems to be clearing away. The emperor, apparently, is regaining his senses, and a little reflection will tell him that an empire ruled by a single despot is the worst form of government known to man. As the center of the empire is coming forward, find their position, recognizing the right of man to govern himself. But, while this is the hope of countless millions, we cannot close our eyes to the fact that discontent is universal among the laboring classes; Poland, crushed beneath the iron heel of Austria and Russia, rises in such mighty strength that the forces of Warsaw are red with the blood of sons, who have never acknowledged the supremacy of either Austria or Russia. 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
