TOLD OF PAUL THE SERVANT OF THE LORD JESUS CHRIST.

Canon Cody Gave An Eloquent Address At Queen's—He Gave A New Life To The Church.

Rev. Canon Cody, M.A., D.D., of Wycliffe College, preached a very eloquent and instructive sermon in old Convocation hall yesterday afternoon.

The speaker dealt with the life of Paul in its many and varied phases and activities. St. Paul, he said, will come to his own again as truth is triumphant.

The first century, said the preacher, was more or less like our own and it is at times such as these in the history of the church, that most men drift along like leaves in a stream.

St. Paul was a Master Christian. He was a remarkable man; had he never been a Christian he would have been found from it.

Paul loved Christ's doctrine for a practical reason. He was a great logician, but his faith safeguarded his logic. He believed that the doctrine was from God and for men and as such he believed it himself and preached it to men.

Paul was a great type of the propagandist, the missionary, not only a thinker but a worker. His great task was to evangelize the Gentile world and the history of Paul is the history of missionary work in the Graeco-Roman world.

Rev. Charles Tyndall, Case Vincent, declines a call to Washington, D.C., and will remain rector of St. James, much to every one's gratification.

Canon Cody preached a powerful sermon on the character and motives of the Pharisee, in St. George's cathedral on Sunday night, taking the middle course between the two extremes, one of which treats the traitor as a misguided, but well-meaning patriot, the other which sets him on such a pinnacle of badness that he is useless as a warning to the sons of men.

The Late Deles Grimsahw. After an illness of over six weeks' duration, from typhoid fever, Deles Grimsahw died on Sunday night, at his home on Williams street, Deceased, aged over fifty, was born on Wolfe Island, the son of William Grimsahw, farmer at the head of the island, he came to Kingston when a young man and engaged in business, his trade, being in various commodities, but in recent years was head of the hay packing and exporting firm of D. Grimsahw & Co. He is survived by wife, one daughter and four sons, all at home. He attended St. George's cathedral and was a member of the I. O. O. F. and U. O. H. C.
