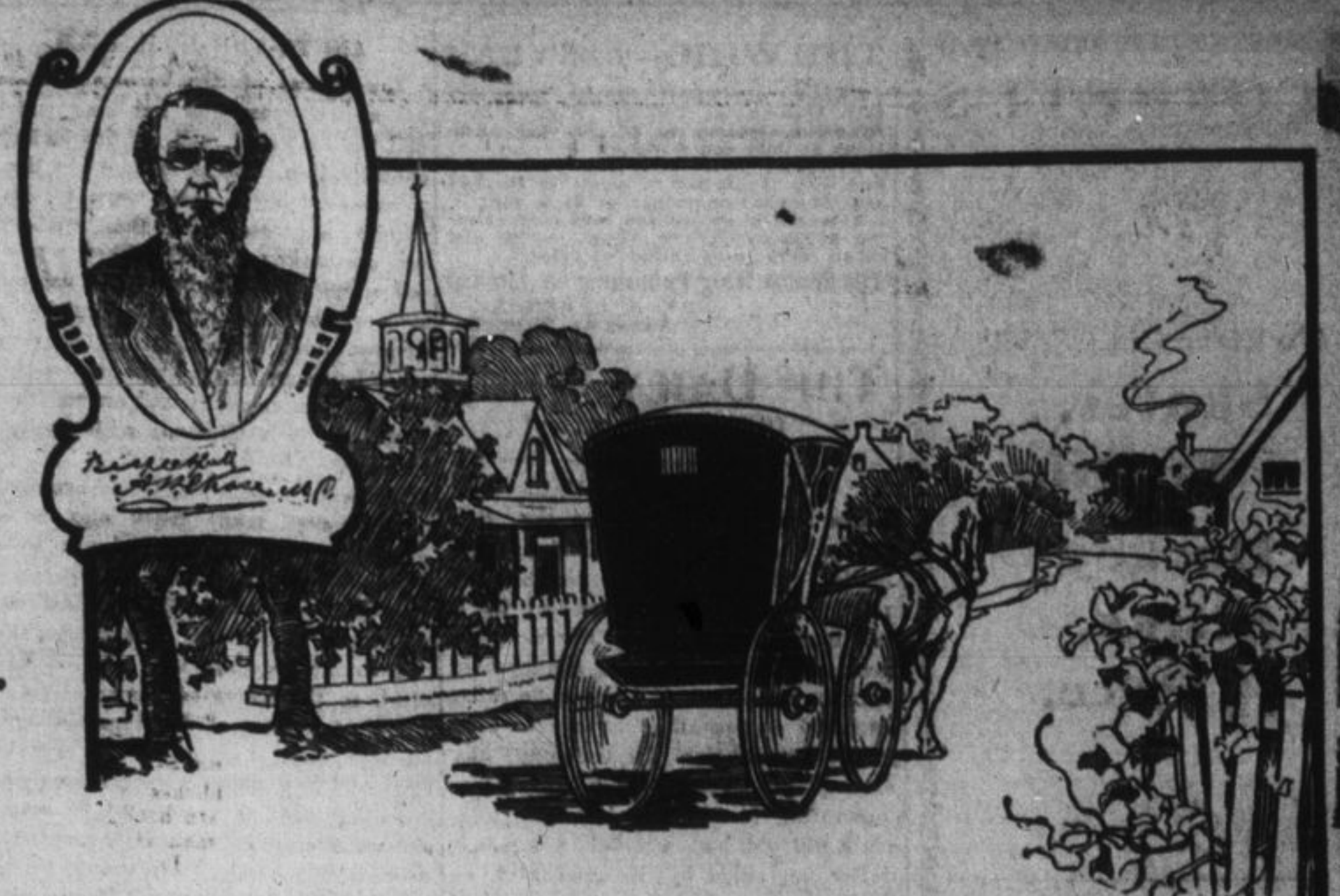

QUEEN'S NEWS. Engineering Students Testing Local Boilers. Queen's University Journal declares that one of the most important and valuable services the Alumni Association can render the university is to undertake at once to prepare a record of all the graduates, who are her staunchest friends, and no one of them should be overlooked. Now that Queen's has become in a special sense a church university, it is held by some that a post-graduate course should be inaugurated, leading to the degree of doctor of divinity, which, at present, is purely honorary. It has been decided to establish an employment bureau in connection with the registrar's office for students desiring work during the summer. An attempt will be made to bring them into touch with persons or corporations desiring their services. The engineering students are being afforded by Prof. Gill and Tongue excellent opportunities of gaining practical experience in boiler tests. Already three tests have been made of different plants in the city, and a forty-eight hour test of the city pumping plant is now on the list. There will be six eight-hour shifts arranged.
