Furnace Reeper Covered With Revolvers While Crime Was Committed - Threatened With Death if he Told of it.

Rochester, N.Y., Feb. 22.-One of the nost shocking crimes in the history of his city was reported to the police, last night, G: W. McCaffery, engineer, in charge of an eighty horse-power boiler in a building on Furnace street, used to heat several business places, told the story. He said that about two o'clock last Tuesday morning, two men and a woman entered the boilerwith a brace of revolvers, the other threw a package into the fire pot on the red hot coals. William J. Allison, who has became wealthy in New York, is about to locate a steel and plate works at Morrisburg, Ont. He stands at the head of a strong company, looking for a Canadian market. Mr. Allison purchased Dry Island, at the foot of the Galoup Rapids, and is having a summer home built thereon. The company asks the people to raise \$80,000 to put in the electric plant to generate power for the works, Thirty thousand dollars goes to the Domin ion government for enlarging the let at the head of the canal and building the flume, the government having agreed to do the work and to give the corporation 1,200 horse pow er at \$2 per horse power. The halance of the \$80,000 is the estimated cost of putting in the electric works and paying for sixteen acres of land.
