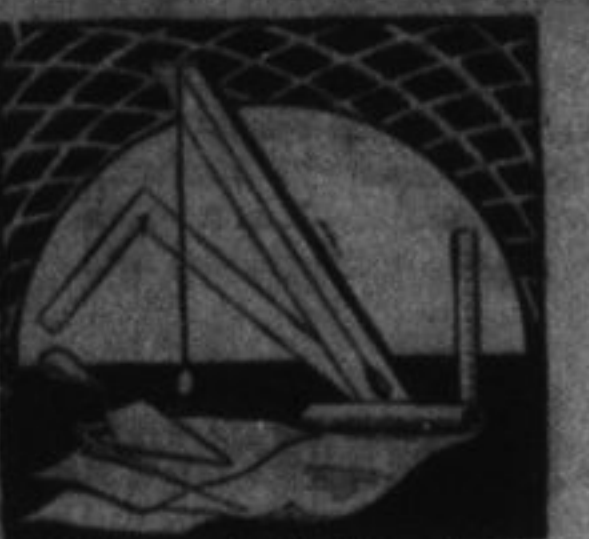

PROTEST FILED

AGAINST THE ELECTION OF MR. PENSE.

Member For Kingston and His Agents Declared Guilty of a Hundred Election Offences—Mr. McIntyre Asks For Member's Disqualification.

This morning a petition was filed with High Court Registrar Asseltine against the election of Mr. Pense as member for Kingston in the Ontario legislature.

The petition makes all the charges outlined in the act, regarding election protests. The member-elect and his agents are charged with all types of bribery, corruption, intimidation, and paying for extra and placing bets on the election.

The petitioner, after reciting a hundred general acts of alleged corruption, prays that Mr. Pense be declared and that in consequence of alleged acts of corruption, he may be disqualified from holding any legislative or municipal office.

In a subsequent statement the petitioner will be required to set forth specific charges against the election of Mr. Pense, giving particulars in regard to all of them.
