



To Revisit Australasia. According to the latest arrangements, Gen. Booth, who is to visit Australia and New Zealand, will leave "In London on the 2nd March, taking the overland route, join the F. and O. steamer at Marseilles, and embarking on his voyage next day. Gen. Booth will disembark at Port

Said on the voyage out to the colonies, and pay a flying visit to the Holy Land. The general's subsequent campaign will embrace large meetings and conferences in the principal cities and towns of Australia, including South Australia, Tasmania, Queensland, and New South Wales; while most important staff councils and the largest gatherings will be held in Mclb urne, Victoria. The trip includes, of course, New Zealand, for which colony an important programme has been mapped out. This is Gen. Booth's fourth

King Edward Does so to Queen Alexandra. The king has given instructions that the honors paid to the sovereign by he guards mounted at Whitehall shall

a future be given to the queen as buring the reign of Queen Victoria a full guard under a captain and subaltern officer was always on duty during the parliamentary session, and on the Coasions of Queen Victoria's visits to London a second subaltern was posted. The king, however, on his accession secreed that a full guard should only be detailed when the sovereign was in residence at Buckingham palace, Late-

y, it was brought to his notice that when he was away from town and the queen was in London, the full honors were not paid to his consort. The Silver Stick, therefore, has ismed an order that the guard shall be on duty at Whitehall if the queen is in condon, even though the sovereign should be absent. Likewise his majesty has ordered that the Royal Standard, which has hitherto only floated from Buckingham palace during his re-sidence there, shall be hoisted when-

ever the queen is in London.

Another instance of the signal honers which the king pays to the queen lies in the fact that her banner is raised in St. George's chapel, at Windsor, to signify that her majesty has been ed to the full privileges of a Anight of the Garter. For many centuries only a queen regnant has enjoy-
