CHURCH WORK

TIDINGS FROM ENDS OF THE EARTH.

The Spread of the Word—A Big Revival Costs Money—An Old Non-Conformist Church in London England.

Rev. Mr. Mithell, pastor of a Baptist church in Montreal, has resigned.
Rev. Dr. Chown will preach in Methodist churches in this city on March 19th.

Rev. W. Harris Wallace has accepted the call to Beverley Street Baptist church, Toronto.
The congregation of Smith's Falls Methodist church, raised \$1,700 at its anniversary on Sunday last.

Rev. E. J. Stobo, Port Dover, has been called to Mount Forest Baptist church. He has accepted the call.
On Sunday last Wesley Methodist church, Vancouver, subscribed over two thousand dollars to missionary expenses.

Walter Nichol, B.A., of Knox College, has accepted the position of assistant pastor at Knox church at Woodstock.
Rev. M. C. McLennan, Kippen, has received and accepted a call from the Southampton Presbyterian congregation.

Bishop Thomas B. Neely, of the Methodist Episcopal church is planning for the erection of a Protestant church in Panama.
The Rev. Dr. Horton will become president of the National Council of Evangelical Free Churches at Manchester this month.

Rev. E. A. Mackenzie, of St. Matthew's Presbyterian church, Montreal, is to receive a call from Knox church, St. Thomas. His was the only name mentioned.

In memory of the late Hugh Price Hughes a window has just been placed in Wesley's chapel, London. The window contains a representation of the last supper.

Fanny Crosby will be eighty-five on March 24th. Scores of churches are already planning to honor her by setting apart Sunday, March 26th, as Fanny Crosby Day.

The Wesley Deaconess Institute, Illinois, England, has sent eleven deaconesses into foreign missionary work. The fields include Ceylon, New Zealand, Cape Colony, and West Africa.

The Methodist church in Germany has inherited two large hospitals under deaconess management. There are 210 deaconesses, including probationers. The property is valued at \$240,000.

George E. Hartwell, Methodist missionary at Chentu, China, states, in a letter to the Methodist mission rooms, that he baptized thirty-one converts in a recent tour of forty-two days' duration.

Rev. Mr. McLaughlin, Presbyterian minister at Harrington, announced to his congregation Sunday that he had decided to resign from his position for the time being, and devote his attention to farming.

Rev. D. J. McLean, pastor of St. Andrew's church, of Arryprior, has resigned, and it was while at Cowfold that "York" wrote his two famous books, "Tristram Shandy" and "A Sentimental Journey."

It is estimated that the great London revival now being conducted at the Royal Albert hall by the American evangelist, Dr. Torrey and Mr. Alexander, will cost \$85,000, about three-fourths of which was contributed before the meetings began. The revival is to last five months.

It is said of the late Charles Haskin, lumberman and philanthropist, of Muskegon, Mich., who died a year ago, that he was worth \$15,000,000 and gave to Muskegon over \$2,000,000 (much of it to churches—every one in the city has never been out of a church or theatrical performance).

Dr. Munro Gibson, the representative Canadian in the religious life of London, has retired from the secretaryship of the Free Church Council, which he has held for the past six years. He still remains a member of the executive, and will devote much of his time to the council's work.

Among the old established Non-conformist churches in London most to be reckoned is Devonshire Square Baptist church. The church was founded in the year 1638, and for the first twelve years was under the guidance of a church elder. In 1650, William Kiffin became the pastor, a position he held for fifteen years. Mr. Kiffin was a wealthy man and was on intimate terms with the royal family, and especially with Charles II.

The issues from the presses of the Bible society last year totalled 1,057,154 Bibles, 1,449,808 testaments and 3,190,309 portions, a total of 5,697,261 books. The number of complete Bibles is about 60,000 above that of the previous year. Never before has the society sent out a "hundred Bibles in a single year. The total issues of the society since its foundation in 1804 have reached the magnificent proportions of 156,680,101 copies of the scriptures.

Some years ago Bishop Brooks was recovering from an illness and was denying himself to all visitors, when Robert Ingersoll called. The bishop received him at once.
