KILLED HIS WIFE

MERRY-MAKERS STARTLED BY CRIME OF JEALOUSY.

Guest Makes Feint to Kiss Woman, Draws Razor Across Her Throat, and Then His Own.

London, March 7.—Many people visited Sheldham street, Edgware road, yesterday, to gaze curiously at the top floor windows of a house in which a sordid tragedy occurred Thursday night.

The man, Frank Percy Kingham, aged twenty-six, a laborer, now lies guarded in St. Mary's hospital, and if he recovers he will be charged with the murder of the girl, with whom he lived in lodgings in Netherwood road, Shepherd's Bush, and whom he is supposed to have married about a year ago.

The girl was very good-looking with a slight, tall figure, a wealth of light hair, and dressed very becomingly. She was one of attraction, and it is said that Kingham had frequent outbreaks of jealousy.

Merry-making took place during the visit, but there were also some angry words, and when the couple rose to leave, after supper, Kingham suddenly drew his arm around the girl's neck. They were present in the room thought that he was going to kiss her; but instead they allege that he drew a razor savagely across her throat. They included the girl's mother—could interfere, they say—that Kingham cut his own throat.

BLACK BUT STILL A NOBLE

Might Have Been Negro in English Passage.

London, March 7.—Katherine, Countess of Stamford and Warrington, who died last week at Bradgate Park, near Leicester, was over eighty years of age, and was the second wife of the seventh Earl of Stamford and Warrington, who died in 1855.

With his death in 1883 the Earldom of Warrington lapsed, while, as he left no son, the former title passed to a remote cousin, who lived in South Africa, where he had married a colored woman named Martha Solomon, who, as Mrs. Peter Pieterse, still survives.

The Countess Katherine appears in the pedigree as the daughter of "Henry Locks, Esq." She was, however, quite humble birth, and before her marriage she appeared on the variety stage, upon which she enjoyed popularity under the name of Kitty Locks.

After her marriage she managed in some way to secure the box at the opera immediately adjoining that of Queen Victoria. Her majesty, on discovering the identity of her neighbor, declined to attend the opera again so long as Lady Stamford occupied the adjoining box.

Lady Stamford protested that she would like to do as she pleased, and she would not do as she pleased, with the result that the opera was not more royally that season.

When Lord Stamford died, he left his widow all his property, to the complete impoverishment of the wife. Lady Stamford's successor in the title the black but comely Martha Solomon, had no son, or there might now be a negro representative of the earldom in Home of Lords. She has a daughter, however, who is entitled to apply for presentation at court at any moment under the undisputed title of Lady Hester Grey.

The present Lord Stamford was a school teacher in the West Indies before he succeeded to the title.

NEWS OF WORLD

NEWSY ITEMS FROM MANY QUARTERS OF EARTH.

Matters That Interest Everybody of Everything Easily Read And Remembered.

Russia proposes to establish another colony in Mexico and to retire in favour of the United States.

Terrorists forced more workmen at St. Petersburg to join the strike, which is now general.

General John H. Regan, when brought into court, in Cleveland, fainted and his trial was adjourned.

The fitting out of the Hamburg-American steamer, recently chartered by Russia, has stopped.

An anarchist plot developed prematurely at Barcelona, Spain, and a number of arrests were made.

General John H. Regan, the last surviving member of the confederate cabinet, is dead at his home in Palestine, Texas.

At Woodstock, on Saturday, the home of Rev. William Ames, retired Methodist clergyman, and father of A. E. Ames, Toronto, was gutted by fire.

It is proposed to establish a rifle association in Wales, and as its meetings would not clash with Bilsley, it is proposed to invite the Canadian team to compete at the Welsh meeting.

Baron Lambemont, secretary-general of the Belgian foreign office, died on Monday following a stroke of paralysis on Saturday. For half a century the baron had much to do with directing the foreign policy of Belgium.

The attempt made by the state of Vermont to have Canada prohibit the exportation of fish caught in the lake with seines.

J. W. Council, M.P.P. for Souris, in the North West Territory, declares that western Roman Catholics do not want separate schools, because although many years ago they had a large number these have now dwindled down to a few. The question, he says, is a purely local one and should be left to the local governments to deal with.

The issue, too, he says, belongs to the people of the territories and to them only.

A Medium Exposed. New York, March 7.—A woman spiritualistic medium was dragged from a cabinet and thrown into the centre of the circle of believers in spiritualism attending a seance in her apartment in Lexington avenue last night, says the World.

She fought against the treatment most desperately. Furniture was smashed, men knocked down and glass broken before she and her husband were finally overcome. When gas jets were lighted she was found gasping in the centre of the seance room, dead in a mass of gauze, coated with phosphorus paint. A Neipman, whom mother, a resident of this city, has spent thousands of dollars in investments in London, and who has been tried at seances at this house of the medium, stated last night that he intended to prosecute criminally and civilly the mediums in this city responsible for his mother's losses.
