COMMERCIAL MATTERS.

What Is Going On In the Business World—The Markets.

A London cable states that New York people were responsible for the recent rise in C.P.R. and Hudson Bay.

The vegetable-growing quartz is reported to have been made in the wild mountains of Kintail, Scotland.

The vegetable growers of Ontario are determined to sell no tomatoes to Canada unless 25 cents net revenue. The price has been 25 cents net revenue.

The Canadian Pacific railway is exporting grain to the United States in quantities in British Columbia with a view to its use if found satisfactory.
