TOTAL YIELD SHOWS GOOD INCREASE.

Largest Producing Water Channel of Lake Huron - Election Cross-Petitions Filed.

special to the Whig. Toronto, March 10.—Deputy Com-missioner of Fisheries Bastedo, to-day, gave out an interesting statement regarding the commercial fisheries of the past year. The total yield of all kinds of fish was 24,009,970 pounds, an increase of 3,030,297 over 1903, the estimated value being \$1,793,229. I here was a decrease in the catches of sturgeon, catfish and tullibe of 9,000, 181,000 and 16,450 pounds respectively. The catch of herring increased 1,161,430 pounds; white fish, 841,530; lake trout, 488,120, and pike, 236,375 pounds. The largest producing water in the province was the north channel of Lake Huron, 4,343,225 pounds of fish being taken there. Lake Erie was the most productive of herring.
