AN OMINOUS THREAT

Kuropatkin Asks to Serve Under Linevitch, and is Accepted—Retreating Russian Pillage Imperial Tombs—Japanese Not Harassing Them.

Since the White Harbin, March 21—"I will enter Harbin on April 10th," Yama has spoken, and the residents of this city believe that the words are prophetic. For Yama said that he would enter Mukden on April 10th, and on that date he swept Kuropatkin's legions before him and occupied the city which had been the scene of Kuropatkin's operations since the disaster of Liao Yang. The Chinese here are in an excited state. They know not whether to flee. If disaster has not overtaken the Russian army long before it reaches this city the task of rescuing the fragments of a once powerful force will be well nigh hopeless. For after Harbin is taken the Russian army is practically impossible. The Russian policy is to retreat, but after Harbin retreat is practically impossible. Many Chinese refugees are arriving from the south. They report ill treatment by the Japanese and say that Russian speaking Chinamen are hanged head downward and parricided. "The Russian Translators say nothing, but the Japanese answer to all such questions are given in Japanese, general, answering a request to pay at least a little for provisions taken, declared that "the Chinese dogs were not deserving of any other treatment."

The population of Bodum, southwest of Harbin, fears the arrival of the Japanese. In the village of Tayntayou, Christians, Chinese, and Moslems, who are noted Chinese bandit leaders, who had been terrorizing the region around Bodum, and turned him over to a Russian guard, which March 15th, brought him to Bodum, after beating off attempts to rescue. It is reported among the Mongols that some time ago a large body of Japanese penetrated deeply into the country westward of Shantung. They were repelled by Prince Kuk. The Japanese are reported to have sent out a second and large detachment.

With the many wounded who are arriving at Harbin from the southward are crowds of Russian inhabitants of the region evacuated and employees of the railroad.
