Minister of Greater New York Preparing for a Campaign—The News From Many Denominations.

Rev. A. A. Shaw, Brookline, Mass., declined to consider a call to Walmer Road Baptist church, Toronto.

Rev. J. M. Wilkinson, Toronto, is leaving the ministry of the Methodist church to enter the life insurance business.

Rev. C. S. Boone, who, till recently, was pastor of the Baptist church, Leamington, has taken a church in Detroit.

Rev. George E. Fletcher, Killaloe, who comes from Dutton, was ordained to the Anglican priesthood by the Bishop of Ottawa.

Rev. Mark Guy Pearce is announced to return to the United States in June next and spend several months in lecturing and preaching.

It is estimated that the new Knox church, St. Marys, will cost about \$18,000. It will have a gallery and seating capacity for about 600.

AMERICAN SENTIMENT.

In Against Proposed Mission Projected by Vatican.

New York, March 25.—The Roman Catholic church, in this country, contributed, last year, in private contributions, and "Peter's penny" a trifling more than \$200,000 to the support of the church's expenses, and at the present rate will exceed that amount by several hundred thousand for 1905. This is the answer to the American bishops gave to the proposal to make Mgr. Federico, of Havana, a sort of commissioner in this country to increase the Peter's penny contributions. The announcement that the pope has withdrawn the mission entrusted to Mgr. Broderick, therefore, was no surprise. Bishop McDonnell, of Brooklyn, and other prelates, who were at Rome, recently, are believed to have voiced the American sentiment against the proposed mission.

At Richport, Maine. Commander Robert E. Peary's Arctic expedition ship was christened Thursday. She was christened Roosevelt by Mrs. Peary.

Flight. Rev. Charles Gore, D.D., Bishop of Worcester, has been enthroned as Bishop of Birmingham. An amusing story is told of Dr. Gore, and is probably not the first, one which has originated through clerical attire. He was once walking in the street when two little boys were attracted by his black cassock gaiters. "Well," asked one, in surprise, "Oh, 'ere's a Scotchman in mourning," was the reply.

A London clergyman tells of crossing one day about God's wisdom being superior to man's, dwelling at length upon the fact that he knows best what we need, and provides what is best for us. As he sat at the desk with his pen in his hand, "You plant geraniums and heliotropes in the sunshine, because you know they will grow better there. But you never plant a shade tree for the foliage." He left that the sermon had been a helpful one, so was

gratified, when, after service, a woman came to him, and said: "Oh, doctor, I am so glad of that sermon." He was about to express his pleasure at having helped her when she added: "I never knew before what was the matter with my fuchsia."

John Hamford, of Clinton, one of the best known and most respected of the laymen of the Church of England, has, with the approval of the Bishop of Huron, instituted a fund to be known as the clergy relief fund, and work which he has asked the lay representatives to assist in making collections. The fund is for the purpose of establishing relief to be given clergy in the outlying missions who may unfortunately be in need of some monetary assistance.

In accordance with the evangelical movement which originated in the British Isles and has spread to nearly every part of the civilized world, the ministers of Greater New York have planned a comprehensive campaign for New York and vicinity. It is proposed to raise and expend \$30,000 in the work in Manhattan Island and vicinity. The work, which will consist largely of open-air meetings, will be begun early in the summer and it is planned to erect ten or more large tents in open lots and parks.

ZANGWILL'S VISIT.

The Bright Dream of a Jewish Nation.

Israel Zangwill's visit to America on behalf of the Zionist movement has renewed popular interest in the subject, and recalls the fact that eight years ago, Theodore Herzl launched the project of a legally assured Jewish people. Application to the Sultan of Turkey resulted in only vague and indefinite promises, as might have been expected. The recent proposal of the British government, due to Joseph Chamberlain's initiative, to establish a Jewish colony in East Africa, has aroused new hopes among the well-wishers of Jewish autonomy. Rabbi N. Calisch, of Richmond, in a thoughtful, paper contributed to April Booklovers' Magazine, states the position of those Jews opposed to the Zionist movement. He says that of the one hundred and fifty congregations in that land that comprise the liberal, reformed Jewish element, one hundred and forty-five are anti-Zionist, both in pulpit and pew. The modern Jew recognizes that his nation ceased to be a political entity long ago, and does not desire its resurrection. He prefers to be a cosmopolitan who gives his allegiance to the land of his adoption. Otherwise he stands accused of being an alien wholly identified with the land he inhabits. In the second place, the modern Jew has obliterated the anniversary of the fall of Jerusalem from his calendar. He no longer mourns over it, and no longer observes it as a day of fasting and prayer. The anti-Zionist Jew, as a political movement, however, he will have none of it.
