REPLY TO FOSTER. KEEN DEBATE ON AUTONOMY BILL AT OTTAWA.

Sir William Mulock's Argument—Dominion Creates Rights of Province—Perpetuate Conditions Existing—When Provincial Status Granted.

Ottawa, March 30.—Two more of the leaders of parliamentary debate addressed the house yesterday on the autonomy bill. Hon. George E. Foster for the opposition, and Sir William Mulock for the government, and presented some new material from the standpoint of each side.

Mr. Foster, who was in a distinctly keen, critical mood, and touched the case generally with a light hand. He unhesitatingly opposed the educational clause of the bill on the ground that it was an infringement of the provincial rights, and defended his own support of the remedial bill in 1906, as a measure in accordance with the constitution and one which had to be supported, even though the majority party took their political lives in their hands.

Sir William Mulock, replying to Mr. Foster in kind, accused him of having abandoned his political principles—first, his political independence to get into the cabinet; second, prohibition, in order to stay there; and later he had abandoned his loyalty to his chief. He told Mr. Foster he should discuss his hypotheticals and not discuss to give lectures on public morals.

In the supreme court, this morning, when the corporation of Delta vs. Wilson was proceeded with, Mr. Taylor, for appellant, was unable to distinguish the case from Mutual Reserve vs. Dillon, 31, S.C.R. 19, and the appeal was quashed without costs.

THE CANADIAN COW. HER YIELD OF MILK GRATFULLY EXCEEDED.

Dairy Commissioner Reports Result of Investigation—Use of Cheese as a Coating for Cheese.

Ottawa, March 30.—J. A. Rudlick, dairy commissioner, in concluding his evidence before the agricultural committee, showed that there is room for a good deal of improvement in the average production of milk by Canadian cows. In Denmark, the investigation of one of his officials had shown the lowest average for herds was 5,000 pounds of milk per cow per year, while some herds went up to 11,000 pounds. In Canada the average is more like 3,000 pounds, with a few as high as 5,000.

In reply to A. F. McLaren, Mr. Rudlick gave particulars of the method of covering cheese with paraffine wax, and said that, though it met with objections in the old country, still it is making its way, and though he would not recommend paraffine wax, he believed the custom could be made general in a year or two. The advantage is the prevention of shrinkage, and thereby keeping the cheese moist and tasty.

At the close of the meeting Mr. Rudlick showed samples of various cheeses, and the members of the committee lunched thereon.
