

Ein Feste Burg. Martin Luther (Eisleben, Saxony, November 10th, 1493-Eisleben, February 18th, 1546) was not only a great preacher; he was also a poet, greatest of the German hymnists. His 'Ein Feste Burg' is commonly called Luther's hymn. Heine calls it "the Marseillaise of the Reformation"; it spread like wildfire everywhere on the lips of the Protestants, being sung ir the cottage, the workshop and the congregation. Based on the 46th psalm, "God is our refuge and strength," and born in the supreme hour of Luther's great conflict, it was one of the potent orces of the reformation. One translation into English was made by Carlyle, who compared it to "a sound of Alpine avalanches." But the translation most generally used to-day was, made by Frederick Henry Hedge, of Massachusetts, in the last century. The German people have carried it with them into every land where they have gone, singing it over to the same soulsublime thought, and its inspiring air have combined to make this one of the great international hymns.
