Confirmed the Judgment Grant-Damages to Widow of An Engineer-To Order the Purchase of Another Bank Concern.

Montreal, March 1.—The court of review has confirmed the judgment of the court below granting \$3,000 damages to Mrs. Thomas H. Atkinson, whose son was killed at Ste. Madeline on September 16th, 1903. The Grand Trunk railway inscribed, in review, against the judgment on the ground that the company was not responsible as the train on which the deceased was engineer, and that with which it collided, were Intercolonial trains, and therefore, the government was responsible. The court confirmed the view that as the Grand Trunk despatcher had charge of the movements of the trains the company was responsible.
