NEWS OF CHURCHES.

THE VARIOUS DOINGS IN THE RELIGIOUS WORLD. Items That Will Interest the Churchgoing Public Gleaned from Many Fields.

The Right Reverend Thomas P. Hickey, is appointed as co-adjutor-bishop of Rochester, N.Y. Rev. H. B. A. Ketchum, B.A., has decided to remain in Peterboro, as assistant pastor of St. Paul's church.

In accepting the canonry of Westchester, Archbishop Wilson has sacrificed a stipend of £1,700 a year at Rochdale for £900 at Worcester.

In addition to 233,000 copies of the scriptures given to the Japanese troops, the British Bible Societies last year sold 102,596 copies in Japan.

Rev. Angus McKay, Presbyterian minister of Lunenburg, Ont., is resigning his charge to go to Scotland, where he will be given one of the old Free churches.

Rev. George Jackson, of Waterloo, Street Methodist Church, Stratford, has accepted a call to Walkerville, and Rev. J. H. Kirkland, of Walkerville, will be invited to take his place.

The Baptist congregation of Stratford, has accepted a majority call to Rev. H. H. Bingham of McMaster University, Toronto, to succeed Rev. Mr. Grant, who recently resigned the pastorate.

In the Japan Christian Endeavor Union there are 128 societies, of which thirty-six are junior organizations. Ten denominations are represented.

Footwear is the largest and most aggressive center of Christian Endeavor in China, there being over 100 societies in the Fuk-Ken province. In the Pekin station of the American board there are ten societies.

Rev. A. J. Manning, in England, to enlist the sympathy of British Baptists with the extension work of their Canadian brethren in the great North-West Territories, into which some of them are posting by myriads from all quarters of the world.

It has been decided to erect in the chapel of St. Thomas of Canterbury, situated in the Park, London, a memorial effigy in marble of Cardinal Vaughan and a fund is being raised to provide as many foundation masses as possible in his memory.

The Archbishop of York has fallen into so poor health that he has had to leave his residence in London. Dr. LaLogan is a man of splendid physique, but the vast amount of work that he has undertaken since his election to the archbishopric has gradually undermined his health.

The West Midland, Eng., Baptist convention celebrated recently the 25th anniversary of its founding. At the celebration it was mentioned that five of the original association were still in existence.

In one of the Linstead churches the other Sunday the arm of a sleeping member of the congregation projected over the end of his seat. When the man with the collection plate came along the plate struck against the projecting limb, and the collection disappeared down the hot-air pipe that pierced the floor at that point.

A site was caused at recent meeting of the National Council of the Evangelical Free Churches of England by a statement by Dr. Wenvon, a returned missionary, to the effect that Christianity in China had not "caught on." The most interesting of the addresses, he said, to the moral evolution of China was sectarianism, which they had allowed to intrude into their missionary work.

The following, from the Bishop of Dorking, is an interesting account of the revival of the valley of the Wash: "Having three days to spare, I spent them in cognito in the heart of a revival district. I have seen a mining village a month after the revival had passed, with four chapels all lighted up and full, not just on Sunday, but most nights of the week, and filled. There was no preaching in the valley, but the difficulty is sometimes to break them up. There is no advertising of bishops or infant preachers, because the work is the work of the Spirit of God."

And then, elevated far and high above all, on a rope, stretched from shore to shore, the bold performer walks calmly over the raging flood, which dashes the water into the two greatest nations upon earth—British and American shores.

Probably few on this earth would attempt to perform this feat, and risk a terrible fall into Niagara's raging flood, multitudes, however, are willing for the sake of fancied pleasure, to risk a certain plunge into the abyss of the blackness of darkness.
