STARTLED CHURCH. YOUNG WOMAN'S STRANGE ACT DURING SERVICE. Recited Poem From Chancel—Requested Seat in Front Pew After Reciting Stanzas of Religious Poem.

Montreal, April 3.—The recital of Mrs. Haverall's poem, "What Will You Do Without?" by a young woman from the steps before the chancel rail, was the remarkable incident that first startled and then awed the congregation of St. Martin's church during the divine service yesterday morning.

The incident occurred immediately after the offertory had been presented. As the sidesmen returned to their seats in the congregation, and the collection plate upon the communion table, while reciting the offertory sentence, "God is not unrighteous that He should forget your work and labor that proceedeth of love," a young woman stepped quietly from a front pew, and took her stand upon the steps of the chancel, facing the congregation.

The incident, due probably to the effects of a mind overwrought on religious matters, was the more remarkable from the fact that the reciter is known as one of the most unostentatious retiring members of the congregation. A devoted church worker, she ranks as the most efficient teacher in the Sunday school. She had been present with other teachers at an early communion service, and in addition to the morning service, attended Sunday school in the afternoon and poem in the evening.

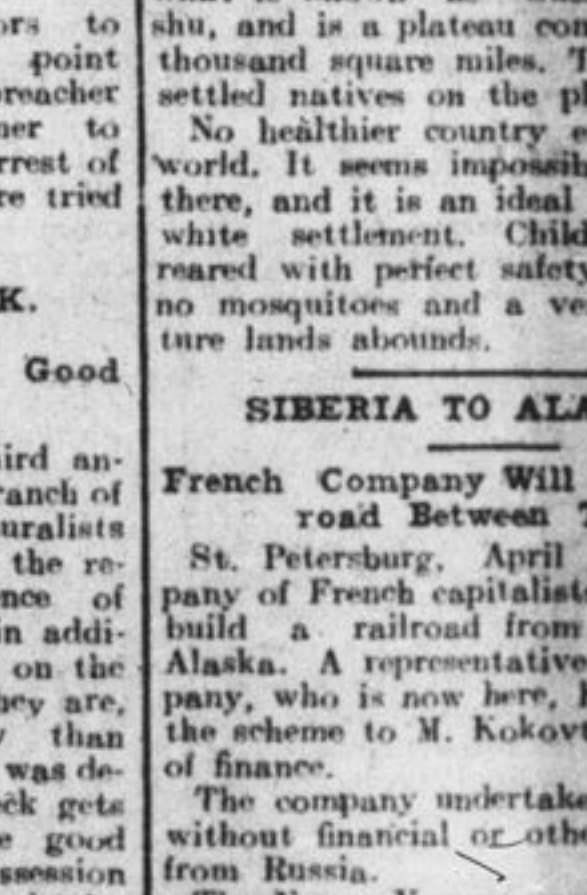

THE BYE-ELECTIONS. The Nominations of the Quebec Cabinet Ministers. Special to the Whig. Quebec, April 3.—Hon. L. R. Bow is re-elected by acclamation in Kamouraska. This is nomination day in connection with the bye-elections for the provincial house, brought about by the resignation of the government consequent upon the retirement of Hon. Mr. Parent from the premiership, and his succession by Hon. Levesque, former minister of public works. So far as known the only minister opposed is the premier, Mr. Gouin, whose opponent is A. St. Martin, labor candidate.

WORKERS TO RULE. Rev. C. O. Johnson Preaches Upon Labor Problem. Toronto Mail and Empire. Toronto, April 3.—A deputation of twenty single taxers waited upon Premier Whitney, this morning, and urged that the present government constitute municipalities the power to change their present taxation if they deemed wise. They pointed out existing evils and said that they were in favor of local option in taxation. The premier thought it a little premature to have a bill of this character presented, before an amendment law had received a trial. He expressed a desire to hear the deputation's views again after the present session.

SIBERIA TO ALASKA. French Company Will Build Rail Road Between Two. St. Petersburg, April 3.—A company of French capitalists proposes to "take back" a railroad from Siberia to Alaska. A representative of the company, who is now here, has explained the scheme to Mr. Kokovtsov, minister of finance, and a board of directors of the company undertakes the scheme without financial or other guarantee from Russia.

SERG. PAT. M'GEE DIED ON SUNDAY, UNDER PECULIAR CIRCUMSTANCES. Had Lived An Adventurous Life—Was a Crimean Pensioner—A Color-Sergeant in 47th Regt.—Caretaker of the Collegiate Institute.

The death of Patrick McGee, a man widely known in the city and vicinity, occurred at his home on Upper William street, during Sunday night, the circumstances surrounding his death being of a peculiar nature. His death occurred some time during the night, and his death was discovered by his wife, in bed, this morning.

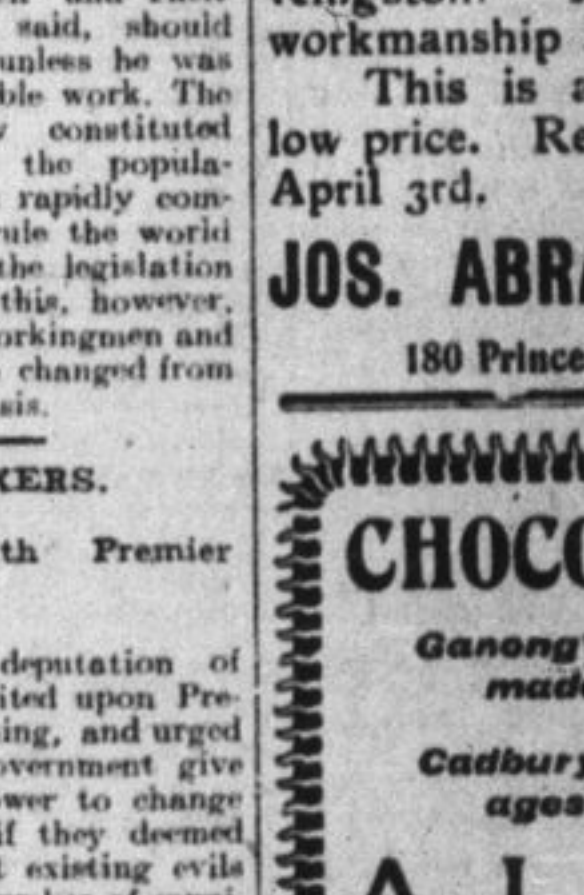
Among the neighbors of the deceased the McGee home, on William street, had not the very best reputation, owing to affairs of a disorderly nature which have taken place there. During the last three or four days the condition of affairs has been especially bad, several men with reputations, by no means the best, having been making the house their headquarters for a drunken spree.

Coroner Kilborn was notified of the circumstances this morning, and ordered that a post mortem be held this afternoon at which it could be decided if an inquest were necessary. The remains were removed, this morning, to S. S. Corbett's undertaking rooms, to await investigation.

The deceased was aged about sixty-seven years, and had lived a life of more than usual adventures and changes of fortune. He served in the Crimean war, being the rank of sergeant, and has drawn his pension, as such for many years past. Since living in Kingston he had been color-sergeant in the 47th Regiment for nearly fifteen years, and he was also caretaker, and drill instructor at the Collegiate institute for a long term of years. Of recent years he has been engaged as caretaker for several city office buildings. He was a man of many good characteristics, and a few failings, and had many friends who will regret his untimely death.

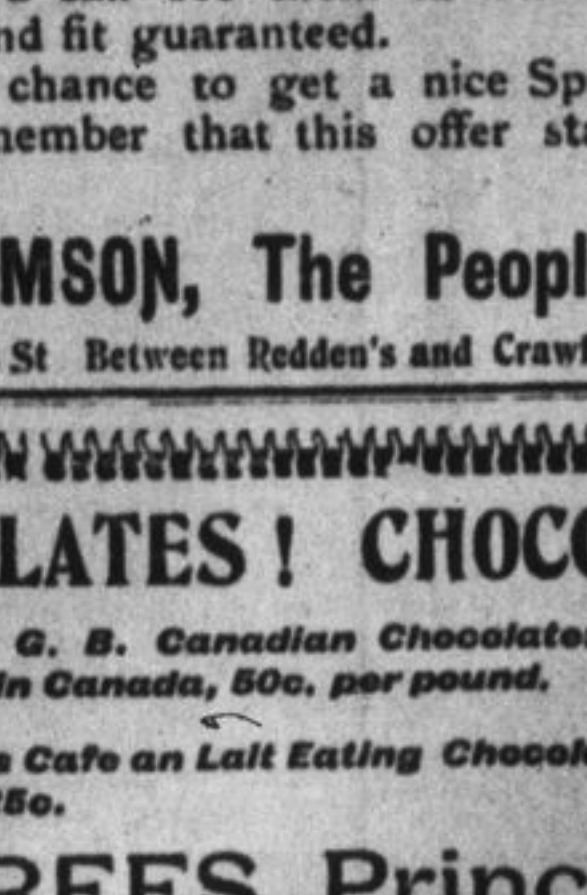

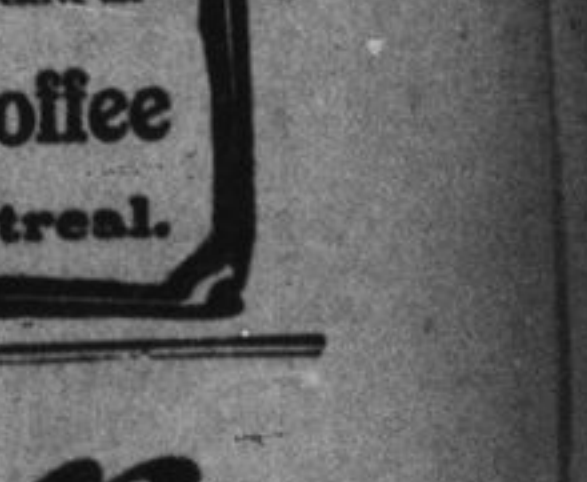

ROMANTIC TALE Lonely Death in the Wilds of the Yukon. Toronto, April 1.—Unique was the last will of one Robert McNeill, whose life had just ended far away in the frozen north, at the headwaters of Stewart river. On a piece of birch bark, he, by the light of a tiny oil lamp, scrawled a last message to his loved ones, bequeathing to them the wealth he had made in the toil some years of prospecting and mining. Viola and Freda Finn, of Spokane, Wash., daughters of the deceased's sister, are the ones to whom the dying man left his property.

The birch bark statement is in the hands of Wm. Rice, a Stewart river prospector, H. J. Ross, who journeyed from the gravestone to bring out the news of the death of McNeill, says McNeill's estate chiefly consists of valuable claims on a river in a rich locality, and may turn out to be worth thousands, Ross says.

About two months ago McNeill and Rice left Dawson for Stewart river. They had just begun to work some promising claims when McNeill was taken ill. I came across them camped in the snow. It was only a few hours before McNeill died. He said he wished to leave his property to his niece, and asked me to hunt them up. We had no paper, so the sick man wrote his will on a piece of bark and Rice and I signed as witnesses. McNeill died that night, and we buried him in the snow.

Strange to say, the father of the two girls died in the north also. He went there at the outbreak of the Klondike excitement and lost his life in a snow-slide, while trying to cross one of the passes.
