SCUDS THE SEAS.

HAS SAILED UNDER TWO FLAGS AND THREE NAMES.

Steamships in Some Ways Like Individuals—Some Have Humdrum Existence, Some Have Stirring Adventures—The Steamer *Hermine*.

Boston Transcript.

Steamships in some respects are like individuals. Some run a humdrum existence from the time they are launched until they finally find their way into the hands of junk dealers, who strip them of all that remains of their past usefulness, then consign them to the flames. Others are precipitated into stirring adventures and even from the moment they enter active service. One of the latter kind is the steamship *Hermine*, which arrived lately from the Mediterranean with a cargo of lemons, a variety of other fruits, oranges, etc. She was built in 1901 at Stockton-on-Tyne for the *Hermine* Steamship company of Austria-Hungary, and hardly had time to show what she was made of before she was chartered by the Russian government to help stock up Vladivostok. Her christening name was Nina, but under the Russian flag this was changed to Frieda.

She loaded a cargo of provision in the Black Sea, and steamed out to the far east, in charge of Captain Zar, an Austrian. Arrive there, the Russian authorities, taking little thought to the benefits which they derived from her fresh supplies, under took to place the ship under arrest, because, he, an Austrian, presumed to command a ship under the Russian flag. The Austrian consul immediately protested himself to telegraph on to the Austrian embassy at St. Petersburg, through whose intervention the arrest was prevented, and Capt. Zar sailed from what might have been a very unpleasant predicament. But if they did not wholly succeed in their purpose, the Russian authorities at Vladivostok accomplished their purpose in part. For Capt. Zar was retained at the command of his vessel, which was turned over to the first officer on board a Russian. In his charge, therefore, she returned to the Mediterranean. On her return she was transferred back to her owners, once more flew the Austrian flag and rode the seas under an American captain. Her name now changed again, to *Hermine*, the appellation under which she has since been plying in the Austro-American trade.

LOCUSTS STOP A TRAIN.

Cover Railway and Are Shoveled Off by Gang.

London, April 4.—A remarkable sight was witnessed recently by passengers in one of the down trains on the Uganda railway, writes a correspondent.

When passing Nairobi, the headquarters of the railway, a dense swarm of locusts, closely followed by an enormous flock of hawks, circling gracefully round in pursuit of their prey, was seen high up in the heaven.

An even stranger sight, and one which told only too plainly of the havoc being wrought in their aerial ranks, was presented by the discarded wings of the locusts scattered to the ground like falling leaves.

Not long ago, while proceeding from Lake Victoria to Mombasa, a train ran into a perfect bank of these destructive pests, which continued, with more or less density, for a distance of nearly forty miles.

In some places they were between four and five inches in depth, but, curiously enough, the entire invasion was confined to a strip of not more than fifty yards on either side of the four-foot way.

As soon as the engine struck the swarm the train was brought to a standstill, and for the next two hours the locusts were kept at bay by the use of shovelling the locusts from the tracks and covering them with sand, the stretch being described as almost overrunning.

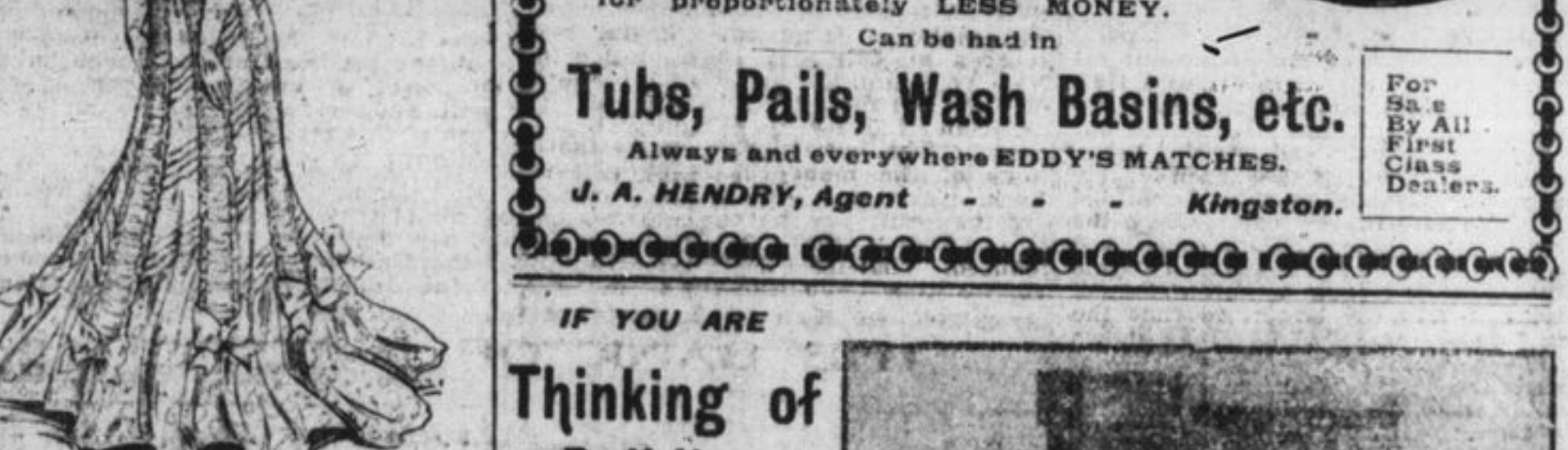

FOODS AND FOOD PRODUCTS.

Prof. M. A. Gray, recently lectured in Montreal on "Foods and Food Products," in the National History society rooms. The lecture was most exhaustive and instructive, dealing with the growth of wheat, its constitution, the electrical treatment of flour, Mr. Gray remarks that but little could be said concerning the percentage of nourishment in the different grades of our North-Western wheat, as it varies from year to year.

Speaking of chemical experiment, Mr. Gray pointed out what had been done in the experiment station of the United States. It was but recently, however, that laboratories had been established in connection with flour mills, and have already demonstrated their utility.

As to the purification of flour by electricity, the speaker remarked that it is about two years since this method was adopted, and the development has been wonderful. A beautiful silvery whiteness is produced by subjecting flour to air which has been passed through a flaming electrical discharge. The flour has also, as a consequence, better keeping qualities, and commands a better price. The Ogilvie Flour Mills company, he said, was the only firm in Canada, and one of the first in America, to make use of this purifying and sterilizing process.

Historic Building Burns.

New York, April 4.—Fire partly destroyed the old observatory of the well-known Dr. Henry Draper, at Huttons-on-the-Hudson, on Friday. There was great danger of the fire spreading to the old red cottage near the observatory, which was used as a blacksmith's shop during the revolution. Some of Washington's officers had their horses shod there.

Dr. Draper had this observatory built in 1810. Here he made the first photographs ever taken of the moon, the nebula and the spectra. Dr. Draper made here the lenses used in his large telescopes. Dr. John William Draper, father of Dr. Henry Draper, was on intimate terms with the inventor of the daguerrotype, and in the building which burned was developed the first picture in America of a human being.
