Dr. James Douglas, Chieflain in Copper Mining—A Native of Quebec Who Has Achieved Fame and Fortune in the United States.

New York, April 5.—Thirty years ago Dr. James Douglas left his native city, Quebec, to seek his fortune in the United States. He has found it, and if all tales be true, a large fortune it is.

He is president of the Copper Queen company, which controls 1,200 acres of the richest deposits in the world, yielding about 100,000,000 pounds of copper a year.

Dr. Douglas has found that the ancient mine of King's Mountain, which was worked on a great scale by the Phenicians of old, those thirty miles have left behind them huge hills of debris separated from their ore, so thoroughly did they effect separation that no modern process, however economical, could be applying to these vast mounds.
