## A BLOCKADE

### OF Vladivostok Is Said To Be Going On.

### IN CRESCENT FORM

### THE JAPANESE ADVANCE UNDER FIVE GENERALS

Have 450,000 men—Togo's Fleet Sighted Near Philippines.

First Encounter Since Armistice Lost Touch at Mukden.

Special to the Whig:

St. Petersburg, April 7.—A despatch to the Canadian Staff Officer dated April 5, said that the first encounters since the armistice lost touch after the Russian retreat at Mukden. It says that a Russian detachment attacked a force of Japanese infantry, about five miles from Kittejou (Kijju), and that the Japanese were dislodged from two positions, one held by the Russian, the other by Cossacks attached.

Advance in Crescent Form.

London, April 7.—The Times says that the latest official information leads to the belief that the Japanese are advancing in a crescent formation. Gen. Goto commanding the left wing, Gen.

Woodstock, April 5. A former in clerical costume, who has been operating in Eastern Ontario, was taken into custody here to-day. At noon he made to have a check cashed at the Crown bank. It was drawn on the Dominion bank by Bishop Sweetman, of Toronto. He endorsed it with the name "C. F. Brooks." The fact that it was drawn on the Dominion bank, made Manager Fuller suspicious. He told his clerical visitor that he would have to call to-morrow, and then telephoned for the police.

The man immediately went to the Traders' bank and presented a similar check, marked "for syndic expenses."

Manager Fuller happened to be well acquainted with the banker's signature, and, inviting the bogus clergyman into his office, locked him in and called the police, who soon took him into custody. The prisoner is a short man about sixty years of age, becoming grey. He admitted this afternoon that he had served time in

Kingston.

An Opinion From Toronto.

Toronto, April 7.—It is not improbable that "C. F. Brooks," in custody at Woodstock, accused of defrauding the Crown bank, is none other than William Lewis Wood, alias Rev. Elwyn Cobb, who was arrested in Toronto on August 22nd, 1902, by the Royal Canadian Mounted Police and Acting Detective Harrison, and subsequently sent to the Central prison, for two years, less one day, by the magistrate, on several convictions of fraud. The methods in the Toronto and Woodstock cases were similar. The perpetrator was dressed as a clergyman, and he presented cheques which were drawn on the same bank. In both cases forged signatures were forced upon him. At Woodstock the name of Bishop Sweetman was used. In Toronto, during the summer of 1902, Wood victimized several dealers in this manner. The description of the Woodstock forger in the precedings is very meagre, but some of the details given correspond, with those of the Rev. Elwyn Cobb, in the Toronto police records.

Port Hope's CLAIMS

To Pass for Independent Canal Survey.

Port Hope, Ont., April 7.—The quarterly meeting of the Port Hope Board of Trade was held, last night, at which regulations were passed concerning trapping traps, and authorizing the officers of the board to sign a petition against them to be presented to parliament. The board also passed a resolution in favor of a duty of two dollars per thousand feet on lumber imported from the United States. It also declared in favor of the town passing an independent bill to cover the route of the Trenton Valley canal from Rice Lake to Port Hope, and will undertake a campaign in favor of Port Hope's claims.
