NEWS OF THE WORLD

OCCURRENCES RECOUNTED IN BRIEF FORM.

Despatches and Cullings Telling of Events Transpiring in All Parts of The Earth.

The S. S. Sicilian has arrived at Halifax.

About twenty Europeans were killed by the earthquakes in India.

An outbreak of fever and diphtheria at Norway House has been stamped out.

Ambassador Choate was elected "master of the bench of the Middle Temple," London.

The bodies in St. Petersburg held a Pan-American Congress, but were dispersed by the police.

The principality of Moulton Ladies' College, Toronto, has been offered to Miss True of Tennessee.

Father Martin, general of the Society of Jesus, Rome, known as the Black Pope, has had his left arm amputated, as the result of a cancer.

Carlos Clarj, accused of choking Luigi Forzi, to death, at Ithaca, N.Y., with a belt strap, in order to rob him of \$82, has been convicted of murder.

Dr. William Osler, regius professor of medicine at Oxford University, has been created an honorary fellow of the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of London.

The betrothal is announced of Victor Gibson, son of Lord Ashbourne, lord chancellor of Ireland and Mrs. Salisbury, daughter of J. L. R. Wood, of New York.

Robert Gavers and William Simmers, two iron workers, employed on the C. P. R. Hotel at Winnipeg, fell off the building, a distance of seventy-five feet, and both were fatally injured.

Frank Lee, of Sheridan street, Watertown, N.Y., has a two-year-old Holstein cow, which gave birth to twin calves, one being fat black and the other white with a few red spots.

TENDERS RESIGNATION.

Dr. G. W. Bell States His Position to the City Council.

The following letter was received last evening by the city council from Dr. G. W. Bell:

To the mayor and members of the city council, Gentlemen, I desire to place the matter of my position as veterinary in connection with the fire department, before your honorable body, and to say that in view of the proceedings at a recent meeting, I desire to withdraw as an employee of the city.

"It is a surprise to me that the fire and health committee accepted of tenders for the position without consulting me with regard to the matter.

This is the fifth year of my connection with the department, and during all that time my relations with the chief and with the other men have been the most cordial and pleasant character.

"It is a question whether, under any circumstances, I would have put a tender in for the position, which calls for professional service, without limit, but at any rate I feel that I had best consider that I could have been shown me, was to have stated what was to take place at the meeting, and given me an opportunity of entering the competition or withdrawing from the department.

"In view of all the facts I have decided to accept the decision of the council in good part, and to enclose herewith my account for services from January 1st, until this date. I have charged the ordinary fees for services and medicines, and trust that the council will have no hesitancy about passing the same.

"Thanking the council and fire department for their courtesy and kindness."

The amount of Dr. Bell's account is \$34.75, which he is fully justified in demanding. He is not obliged to furnish the medicines to the department, though he has done so. The number of visits was large because of two horses being sick for some time.
