A BIG BATTLE

Is Expected Hourly Between Rival Fleets.

EXPERTS AGREE

IT WILL OCCUR OFF ISLAND OF FORMOSA.

Fight in Korean Straits Predicted Too—Japanese Press Issues Warning That Breaches of Neutrality, East of Singapore Won't be Tolerated.

Special to the White. London, April 15.—The Times correspondent cables: News of a battle between Rojostevensky and Togo is hourly expected. Experts agree that it must take place off the island of Formosa. The Russian squadron may be retarded by coaling, and by awaiting the return of the hospital ship Orel, which called at Saigon to deliver and receive despatches, and take on stores. Some are inclined to believe that Rojostevensky will remain south until the arrival of Admiral Negobatos, but this appears impossible, owing to the absence of any base. One expert predicts a second battle in the Korean straits.

The Times correspondent at Tokio cables: The Japanese press writes strongly in reference to possible breaches of neutrality in favor of the Baltic fleet, and declares that although such incidents were tolerated, west of Singapore, they cannot be indulged for a moment east of that place.

The Orel's Cargo. Saigon, April 15.—The Russian hospital ship, Orel, stayed here for thirty-six hours. She shipped 300 tons of coal, besides food and medicines. A doctor on board of her stated that the fleet was bound for Vladivostok. Four German colliers, which anchored off Cape St. James, left this evening.

Near Tzar Banks. Paris, April 15.—The Echo De Paris says that Admiral Rojostevensky's fleet is in the neighborhood of the Tzar Banks, 300 miles southwest of Formosa.

Out Telegraph Lines. St. Petersburg, April 15.—A despatch from Gen. Linvitch dated April 13th; to Emperor Nicholas says: Our cavalry on April 9th, destroyed the railroad, and wires near Yanzouia and between Kaituan and Changta, and April 10th, our cavalry cut the telegraph line near Kaiyuan.

Main Force Reaches Kirin. Tokio, April 15.—It is reported that the main force of the Russians, which retired in the direction of Hsing King, has reached Kirin. The rear guard, consisting of 8,000 men, at Iyue-chow, Hailuow, and Atsinpao, keeping in touch with the Japanese forces. Chang Chen is evidently the railway point for the Changta and Falkumen forces.

Interview With Okuma. London, April 15.—The Tokio correspondent of the Telegraph, says that in an interview ex-Prime Minister Okuma stated that Japan did not intend to repeat her present enormous expenditure of blood and treasure. Russia, must, therefore, be deprived of all strategic advantages in the far east. She must not be allowed to keep fleets near the coasts of China or Japan, while Port Arthur, Vladivostok and the Island of Saghalien must be annexed to Japan. Japan did not seek to leave Manchuria. She only wanted the open door there. She intended to be respected, and to be consulted in the solution of international problems. She must have full power for expressing her opinions in East Asia.

SLASHED BY KOREANS.

Kentucky Medical Missionary Horribly Wounded. Versailles, Ky., April 15.—Dr. Wiley H. Forsythe, formerly of Versailles, who is in Korea as a medical missionary, was recently attacked by a band of Korean rebels, according to advices received here, and horribly wounded. Dr. Forsythe was called into the interior to attend a Korean gentleman who has been throb by robbers. He stepped for the night at the village of Mankoi. During the night the house was broken into by the rebels and Forsythe being unarmed was at their mercy. His skull was fractured, one of his ears severed, and he received other dangerous wounds. Dr. Forsythe went to Korea last year.
