Singapore, April 17.-The North German Lloyd steamship, Prinz Heinrich, reports that she sighted eighteen vessels of the Russian Baltic squadron in Kamerahn Bay, at noon, on Friday last. The steamer did not sight any Japanese warships. The seven Dutch Batavia to day. Kamerahn Bay is Cochin China, about 200 miles northeast of Saigon.

Has Changed His Course. London, April 17.-It is considered, here, that little, if anything, can be inferred from the report made by the captain of the German steamer, Prinz Heinrich, at Singapore, that he had seen warships in Kamerahn Bay. It is pointed out that these might have been colliers and transports, from which Admiral Rojestvensky had taken what he wanted, and then proceeded north with his fighting ships. Kamerahn Bay is in land-locked harbor,
