A Fractical Beginning to Be Made Within That Time-The Ontario Electric Railway Bill Considered

The bill for an extension of three years for the beginning of the Ontario Electric railway was again before the railway committee of the legislature on Wednesday; and met a repetition of protest against locking up so much territory as that between Cornwall and Toronto, with branch lines of thirty miles as desired. It was shown that offices had been carried on for a year and a number of township by-laws passed, while a score more were projected. But Messrs Kerr, and Beck asked, for evidence of actual work, for something besides financial projection, Messrs Graham and Pense pointed out the absence of railway competition along the whole line of the main road between Brockville or Kingston, and Toronto, of the actual non-existence of going electric lines in Eastern Ontario, save in the city of Ottawa, of the absence of desire 40 build any, either as main or branch lines, and of the unreasonableness of building small sections, as only a through line of at least one hundred miles would pay. Mere local traffic would be insufficient. But the opposers still objected to Eastern Ontario locking itself up, even though there was no temptation to build.
