Big Guns Replaced. Hong Kong, May 1.—The dockyard at Kowloon has replaced three 45-ton wire-bound 12-inch barbette guns of the British battleships Albion and Glory.

Where Fleet Lies. Saigon, May 1.—The Russian squadron is lying off Port Dayet, forty miles north of Kamranh Bay and outside of territorial waters, Russian.
