It would advance the business if trons of factories were to realize that it would be in their interest to pay. slightly more for manufacturing. In order to keep pace with the advancement in the arts of cheese and butter-making, better equipment and better buildings are required, and it seems to be inevitable that the price for manufacturing must be slightly increased. It would certainly pay the patrons of factories to give a little


