The Canadian North-West. HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS

Any even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba or the North-West erritories, excepting 8 and 26, which has not been homesteaded, or reserved to by any person who is the sole head of afamily, or any male over 18 years of age

Entry may be made personally at the local land office for the district in which the land to be taken is situated, or if the homesteader desires he may, on application to the Minister of the Interior, Ottawa, the Commissioner of Immigration, Winnipeg, or the Local Agent for the District in which the land is situated, receive authority for some one to make entry for him. A fee of \$10 is

charged for a homestead entry. A settler who has been granted an entry for a homestead is required by the provisions of the Dominion Lands Act, and the amendments thereto, to perform the conditions connected therewith, under one of the following plans: (1) At lease six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year during the term of three years. It is the practice of the Department to require a settler to bring 15 acres under cultivation, but if he prefers he may substitute stock; and 20 head of cuttle, to be actually his own property, with buildings for their accommodation, will be accepted instead of the cultivation. (2) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased), of any person who is eligible to make a homestead entry under the provisions of this act, resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entere for by such person as a homestead, the requirements of this act as to residence prior to obtaining patent may be satisfied

The term "vicinity" used above is meant to indicate the same township, or an adjoining of cornering township. A settler who avails himself of the provisions of Clauses (2). (3) or (4) must cultivate 30 acres of his homestead; or substitute 20 head of stock, with buildings for their accommodation, and have besides 80 acres substantially fenced. The privilege of a second entry is restricted by law to those settlers only who completed the duties upon their first homsteads to entitle them to patent on or before the 2nd June, 1889. Every homesteader who falls to confply with the requirements of the homsetead law is hable to have his entry cancelled, and the land may be again thrown open for entry.

APPLICATION FOR PATENT

Should be made at the end of three years, before the Local Agent, Sub-Agent or the Homestead Inspector, Before making application for patent, the settler must give six months' notice in writing to the commissioner of Dominion Lands at Ottawa of his intention to do so INFORMATION

Newly arrived immigrants will receive at the Immigration Office in Winniper, or at any Dominion Lands Office in Manitoba or the North-West Territories, information as to the lands that are open for entry, and from the officers in charge Debility


