### THE LATEST NEWS FROM THE DIAMOND.

Boston So For is the Tall Ender—Corridon Can Use Either Hand in Pitching—The News-iest of General Sport.

Toronto bowlers won from Buffalo in two games. The Brantford Lacrosse Club has elected a new list of officers and will have a strong team.

The Toronto will not support the Chippewas' application for readmission to the senior C. L. A.

Galt and the Royal Canadians of Toronto, will play the return game for the senior championship of Ontario Football Association, on Saturday, at Galt.

Hackenschmidt will go to Montreal to wrestle Emile Maupas at Sohier Park, Monday night. The Russian has undertaken to throw the French wrestler three times in an hour, Gracco-Roman style.

"Young Corbett" and Eddie Hanlon are none too well pleased at being side-tracked for White and Britt. But the little fellows will not have long to wait. Matchmaker Croggins, of the San Francisco A. C. has taken the match off the hands of Morris Levy, of the Hayes Valley organization, and if present plans hold will put Hanlon and Corbett in the ring at Woodward's on the night of June 2nd.

Eddie Duran, the Toronto oarsman, replying to a proposition, says he cannot postpone his race with Sullivan so as to have the event come off on the Fraser river, during the Dominion fair, at New Westminster, but he is ready and willing to meet Towns, the Australian, on the Fraser, during the fair, for the championship of the world.

The Chippewas were declared in good standing by President Allen, at Thursday night's meeting of the C. L. A. clubs, and the proceedings of last Friday's meeting, when the schedule was adopted, were ruled illegal. The Toronto, St. Catharines and Brantford delegates refused to draft another schedule including the Chippewas, and there is a deadlock. Another adjournment was made until next Tuesday night.

Frank Erne will try to regain lost honors in the ring. He has been training diligently all week, and claims that he can make 133 pounds.

Baseball Tips. Pitcher Conreen has been released by Baltimore.

Short-stop Pastor did not last very long with Rochester.

Bill O'Hara has been let out by Toledo. He is a Toronto boy.

Rochester has released DeGroot and Pitcher Matern to Utica.

Clymer and Warner have been suspended for their "scrap" at Pittsburg on Monday.

Thielman, the pitcher who was with Toronto a few seasons ago, is now with St. Louis.

President Pat Powers is after all his enemies. He declares he will drive them out of baseball for all time.

With Currie, Falkenberg, Applegate, Leary, McClehan, Wade, Magay, Adams, and Crayall, on hand, the Toronto, are well off for pitchers.

The Toronto have made a splendid showing on the trip abroad, considering the practice they have had. The long series at home ought to land them on top.

Washington, which was last in the American League race in 1904, is now in second place and winning regularly. The Boston, champions last year, are tail-enders, but are beginning to win games.

Harry Pulliam, president of the National League, is the first prominent baseball man to voice the growing opposition to the appeal. This protest will find an echo all over the circuit.

Bertie Duggan, once a star pitcher with the old Chicago Blues, back in 1890, is managing a team of Amazons in Dahomey, a smallish team organized by him among the members of the king's best regiment of Amazons.

Manager Duke Harley has signed Pitcher Bill Crayall for Toronto. Crayall is a left-hand pitcher, and is not only a good pitcher, but a good hitter. He was held by Toledo last year, but jumped to Burlington. Toronto tried to get him from Toledo this spring, but the later management would not hear of it. Crayall lives in Toronto during the winter.

Corridon, of the Philadelphia National League team, is ambidextrous. He can pitch part of the game right-handed and then turn around and finish strong with his left. This was once a common trick with Pitcher Bill Gettys, who was prominent in the east years ago. He could face the batter squarely and no one could tell with which hand he was going to deliver the ball, and had speed, control and curve with either hand. Jack Powell also can pitch with either hand.

Tobacco And Government. Cincinnati Inquirer. Tobacco has a great deal to do with the governmental affairs of the world. The French treasury report of the tobacco monopoly for 1904 shows a clear profit of \$71,000,000. The government receipts from tobacco tax in Great Britain last year were \$30,000,000. In the United States the government collects \$45,000,000 from tobacco in internal revenue taxes. In Italy tobacco selling is a government monopoly and will yield a net profit this year of \$15,000,000, and Austria-Hungary expects to collect about the same amount. ## VALUE OF BREED.

### Wise Dairyman Looks to Breed of His Herd.

A great deal of loose and unscientific talk is going the rounds of agricultural papers to the effect that it is not breed that makes the good cow, but rather type. "Pay no attention to breed, but look for the cow that is a good milk," says one. "Breed or pedigree is of no value," says another. "What we want is the cow that will do the business." Such ideas may be well enough if the farmer is buying his cows in the market and pays no attention to the breeding of good cows. But when it comes to the production of the cow, then breed and pedigree do count. The bull is half the work; he is half of every good cow and of every poor cow. We select this very important half by what his antecedents are; his ancestry must be in the pronounced dairy line, no matter how dairy like his form, or else we will be making serious mistakes with our purpose to produce good cows.

The fact is, the business of becoming a wise and successful dairyman includes the ability to breed and produce good cows with profitable certainty, and a large part of the quality we want in a good cow is that, when properly mated, she contains dairy blood enough to bring us another cow as good or better than she is.

Where would the grand dairy bred cows that contended for superiority at the world's fair in Chicago, Buffalo and St. Louis have come from, if not from the men who bred them and their progenitors for hundreds of years back had paid no attention to breed?

Breed is just as essential in cows as it is in hogs, horses, sheep, dogs or poultry. It is the fountain we draw upon for the construction of an animal that shall suit the special purpose of the farmer.

ANNUAL CHURCH CONGRESS. Eminent Churchmen from All Over States There.

New York, May 6.—Brooklyn will be the scene of a notable gathering next week when eminent churchmen from all parts of the country will assemble for the annual meeting of the American Church Congress. Bishop Brewster, Moderator, will preside over the sessions, which will begin on Tuesday and continue three days. Other prominent participants will include Bishop Mackay-Smith, of Pennsylvania; Bishop Strang, of East Carolina; Bishop Lines, of Newark, Louis Howland, of Indianapolis; Bishop Bayard, of Southern Virginia, and Rev. Dr. R. Heber Newton, of New York.

The prominent topic of discussion will relate to the future of the negro in America. Other topics of the week will be the institutional church, the Bible as history, the outcome of the theological movements of the nineteenth century, and the essentials of spiritual life.

How Mexicans Test Eggs. It is a common sight in the plaza in a Mexican town to behold a stall-woman who is selling two reals worth of eggs pick them up one by one, put one end and then the other to her lips and hand them over to the customer, who repeats the same operation. To the inexperienced onlooker it seems as if they were tasting the extremities of the eggs. As a matter of fact, they never touch the eggs with the tongue. The idea of the performance is that when an egg is fresh one end is distinctly colder than the other. The end which has the air chamber is warmer of the two. The human lips are extremely sensitive to heat and cold, and even the novice at this form of egg-testing promptly becomes a capable judge. If both ends of the egg reveal the same temperature, that egg may be counted as bad; as it is a fairly good sign that the air chamber is broken, and the contents spread equally within the shell.

Cement Floors For Horses. Cement floors are certainly valuable in conserving all the manure, but they, like most other things, have their faults. A cement floor is slippery, thus dangerous. It is also a very cold floor during the winter months. Furthermore, if used under horses which have calks on their shoes it will soon wear out. The best all round floor for the horse stable is made of cement and plank. Cement the bottom, then put a plank frame on top of it. The planks should be about four inches wide and placed an inch apart. Such a floor will be warm, and at the same time save all the liquid manure. The plank should not be permanently fastened in, better to have it so that it may be raised up occasionally so that the cement may be thoroughly cleaned and sprinkled with some liquid plaster. There is no kind of floor so good for the horses' feet as an earth floor, but it is very hard to keep such a floor in good condition. Horses, especially if idle, will paw the same, thus it will soon become very uneven. It is also difficult to keep an earth floor dry during wet weather.
