

The pallium, meaning literally, lamb's wool, embroidered with purple crosses, and is worn about the neck episcopal rank, including patriarchs and metropolitans. In former times it was made of purple embroidered linen and was worn by all bishops. It has two pendants, one hanging down breast, and the other down the back of the wearer. The pallium is worn at all times by the pope, but only on olem noccasions by others. It can never be transferred to another person, and it is always buried with the body of the man who wore it during life. Right Rev. John Joseph Glennon, who is to be the recipient of the disaished honor to-morrow, was born in Kinnegard, County Meath, Ireland June 14th, 1802, graduated from All Hallows College, Dublin, in 1883, and was ordained priest a year later. He came to America soon after his ordination, and became assistant pastor of St. Patrick's church, in Kansas City, From 1887 to 1892, he was pastor of the cathedral there under Bishop Hogan. In 1892 he became vicar-general of the diocese, and two years later ad ministrator. He was appointed co-adjutor bishop of Kansas City, with the
