

The Canadian North-West.

HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS Any even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba or the North-West Territories, excepting 8 and 26, which has not been homesteaded, or reserved to provide wood lots for settlers, or for other purposes, may be homesteaded upon by any person who is the sole head of afamily, or any male over 18 years of age to the extent of one-quarter section of 160 acres, more or less.

Entry may be made personally at the local land office for the district in which the land to be taken is situated, or if the homesteader desires he may, on application to the Minister of the Interior. Ottawa, the Commissioner of Immigration, Winnipeg, or the Local Agent for the District in which the land is situated, receive authority for some one to make entry for him. A few of \$10 is

HOMESTEAD DUTIES A settler who has been granted an entry for a homestend is required by the provisions of the Dominion Lands Act, and the amendments thereto, to purform during their palmy days, when Brod-erick was president of a national bank at Elkhart, which he and Walter Brown, a former well known politician and society man, were charged with wrecking, and when Woods was head of a national bank at Matthews.

Newly arrived immigrants will receive at the Immigration Office in Winnip or at any Dominion Lands Office in Manitoba or the North-West Territories, formation as to the lands that are open for entry, and from the officers in that free of expenses, advice and assistance in securing lands to suit them. Full information respecting the land, timber, coal and mineral laws, as well as respect Dominion Lands in the Railway Beit in British Columbia, may be obtained up application to the Secretary of the Department of the Interior, Ottawa; to Commissioner of Immigration, Winniper, Manitoba; or to any of the Dominion Lands Agents in Manitoba or the North-West Territories.
