TRAGEDY OF POISONING. Tragic Death of Miss Olive McCaslin. Inroquois, Ont., May 17.—The many friends of Miss Olive McCaslin were shocked to hear of her sudden death. She was alone in the house all evening and retired early to her bedroom. Later on in the evening a neighbor heard some noise outside his house and on going out discovered the unfortunate girl in her night robes prostrate. Medical aid was summoned at once, but she was beyond relief, as the deadly poison had already taken effect. Part of a small bottle of carbolic acid was found uncorked in her room afterwards, but further particulars have not yet come to hand. Miss McCaslin was the only daughter of Richard McCaslin. She was about twenty-five years of age and highly thought of. The suicide theory is entertained.
