Thirty years ago, he said, the city leased a large area of moss land at shilling per acre per annum for thirty years. The refuse was dumped upon this hitherto, almost valueless property, with the result that at the end of the term it had become valuable arable land, worth in the market for farming purposes £2 per acre. The city's interest in the land, of course, ceased with the termination of the lease. Now the municipality buys its lumbing grounds outright, reclaims the land, and grows upon it corn and other products for feed to be used in

the city's barns. "Thirty-three years ago," said Councillor Willock, "our gas supply, then in the hands of two companies, was bought at a valuation. We made the mistake of putting the value into pernetual annuities, which involved the payment of nine per cent, on £300,000 and 6%c, on £120,000. These £100 shares are now worth about £285, and we are now buying them up, offering as an inducement to the holders, £300 shares of corporation stock bearing 3 per cent, interest for every share of the gas annuities. Within the past two years we have secured a large amount and it is the intention to wipe the annuities out altogether. The revenue last year from the gas department was £819,913, the rate per thousand cubic feet being 2s, for motor power and 2s. ld. for light. The rate allows for interest on all capital for a sinking fund which will clear off the whole eapital in forty years, and we also provide large sums for depreciation

"Our water is supplied to a popula on of 1,100,000, and we send into the city sixty-two million gallons day. The cost of construction, includ ing the annuities or the old companies, which were brought up, amounted to four million pounds, but the domestic rate within the city limits is only

HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS Any even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba or the North-West Territories, excepting 8 and 26, which has not been homesteaded, or reserved to provide wood lots for settlers, or for other purposes, may be homesteaded upon by any person who is the sole head of afamily, or any male over 18 years of age to the extent of one-quarter section of 160 acres, more or less.

Entry may be made personally at the local land office for the district which the land to be taken is situated, or if the homesteader desires he may, application to the Minister of the Interior, Ottawa, the Commissioner of Int Wedding." Aside from the plot, which situated, receive authority for some one to make entry for him. A fee of \$10

HOMESTEAD DUTIES

A settler who has been granted an entry for a homestead is required by the provisions of the Dominion Lands Act, and the amendments thereto, to perform the conditions connected therewith, unde one of the following plans:

(1) At lease six months' residence upo and cultivation of the land in each year during the term of three years. It is the practice of the Department to require settler to bring 15 acres under cultivation, but if he prefers he may substistock; and 20 head of cattle, to be actually his own property, with but their accommodation, will be accepted instead of the cultivation.
(2) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased), of any person who eligible to make a homestead entry unde the provisions of this act, resides up a farm in the vicinity of the land entere for by such person as a homestead, t by such person residing w th the father or mother.

(3) If a settler was entitled to and has obtained entry for a second homestead the requirements of this act as to residence prior to obtaining patent may be satisfied by residence upon the first homestead, if the second homestead is in the (4) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by h in the vicinity of his homestead, the requirements of this act as to residence be satisfied by residence upon the saidland.
