

WIDE SLEIGH RUNNERS BE ENFORCED.

Use to Cities and Other Stated Points-The Decision on Question-Benevolent perties. Work.

The greatest "scrap" of the Ontario egislature this session was in the municipal committee, upon the bill of memor Tucker to enforce wider sleigh runners. The northern counties made a great complaint because of the narrow tracks leading to crowding of teams and to unsteady travelling. toppages, delays, and injuries. The heavy snows of two winters past creased the troubles.

The bill proposed that in all counties, and in cities under 50,000 people, no one after December 1st, 1906; should use a sleigh less than dour feet wide on outer edges-penalty from \$5 o \$10 single coefers and pleasure ehicles exempted. The rural pers were wild for its adoption, having brought the bill up session after session and been exasperated by de feats. Hon. Messrs. Hanna and Monteith advocated extension of time in the date of institution of the change. But this was stoutly resisted, and the argument was fast and furious. The counties west of Brant and Oxford claimed exemption, as they had only few tlays of sleighing yearly and rarely faced snowed-up highways, while the changing of sleigh widths would cost from 86 to 825 for each members, and with the option given o any county also to exempt itself from the operation of the act. This

HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS Any even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba or the North-West Territories, excepting 8 and 26, which has not been homesteaded, or reserved to provide wood lots for settlers, or for other purposes, may be homesteaded upon by any person who is the sole head of afamily, or any male over 18 years of age o the extent of one-quarter section of 160 acres, more or

Entry may be made personally at the local land office for the district in which the land to be taken is situated, or if the homesteader desires he may, on application to the Minister of the Interior, Ottawa, the Commissioner of Immigration, Winnipeg, or the Local Agent for the District in which the land is situated, receive authority for some one to make entry for him. A fee of \$10 charged for a homestead entry. HOMESTEAD DUTIES

A settler who has been granted an entry for a homestead is required by the provisions of the Dominion Lands Act, and the amendments thereto, to perform

the conditions connected therewith, unde one of the following plans:

(1) At lease six months' residence upo and cultivation of the lan year during the term of three years. It is the practice of the Department to require settler to bring 15 acres under cultivation, but if he prefers he may substitute stock; and 20 head of cattle, to be actually his own property, with buildings for their accommodation, will be accepted instead of the cultivation. (2) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased), of any person who i eligible to make a homestead entry unde the provisions of this act, resides upon farm in the vicinity of the land enters for by such person as a homestead, the requirements of this act as to residence prior to obtaining patent may be satis by such person residing w th the father or mother, (3) If a settler was entitled to and has obtained entry for a second homestea the requirements of this act as to residence prior to obtaining patent may be satisfied by residence upon the first homestead, if the second homestead is in the vicinity of the first homestead. (4) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by his in the vicinity of his homestead, the requirements of this act as to residence may satisfied by residence upon the saidland. The term "vicinity" used above i meant to indicate the same township, or an adjoining of cornering township. A settler who avails himself of the provisions of Clauses (2), (3) or (4) must cul tivate 30 acres of his homestead, or substitute 20 head of stock, with for their accommodation, and have besides 80 acres substantially fenced. The privilege of a second entry is restricted by law to those settlers only who completed

the homsetead law is liable to have his entry cancelled, and the land may be again thrown open for entry. APPLICATION FOR PATENT Should be made at the end of three years, before the Local Agent, Sub-Agent or the Homestead Inspector. Before making application for patent, the settler must give six months' notice in writing to the commissioner of Dominion Lands at

Ottawa of his intention to INFORMATION Newly arrived immigrants will receive at the Immigration Office in Winniped at any Dominion Lands Office in Manitoba or the North-West Tecritories, inormation as to the lands that are open for entry, and from the officers in charge free of expenses, advice and assistance in securing lands to suit them. Full information respecting the land, timber, coal and mineral laws, as well as respecting Dominion Lands in the Hailway Bert in British Columbia, may be obtained upon application to the Secretary of the Department of the Interior.
