

The Canadian North-West. HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS

Any even numbered section of Dominion Lands is Manitoba or the North-West Territories, excepting 8 and 26, which has not been homesteaded, or reserved to provide wood lots for settlers, or for other purposes, may be homesteaded upon by any person who is the sole head of afamily, or any male over 18 years of age to the extent of one-quarter section of 160 acres, more or less.

Entry may be made personally at the local land office for the district in sich the land to be taken is situated, or if the homesteader desires he may, on plication to the Minister of the Interior. A settler who has been granted an entry for a homestead is required by the provisions of the Dominion Lands Act, and the amendments thereto, to perform the conditions connected therewith, unde one of the following plans:


