DINNER AT CLUB TO HONOR CANADIAN.

From Our Own Correspondent. Chicago, May 21.—Monday morning the police found the body of E. J. Connelley, a painter, at his home on Sixty-third street. There were two bullet holes in Connelley's head, and two revolvers lying near him with an empty chamber in each, and it is thought the man committed suicide.

A GAY LONDON MAN

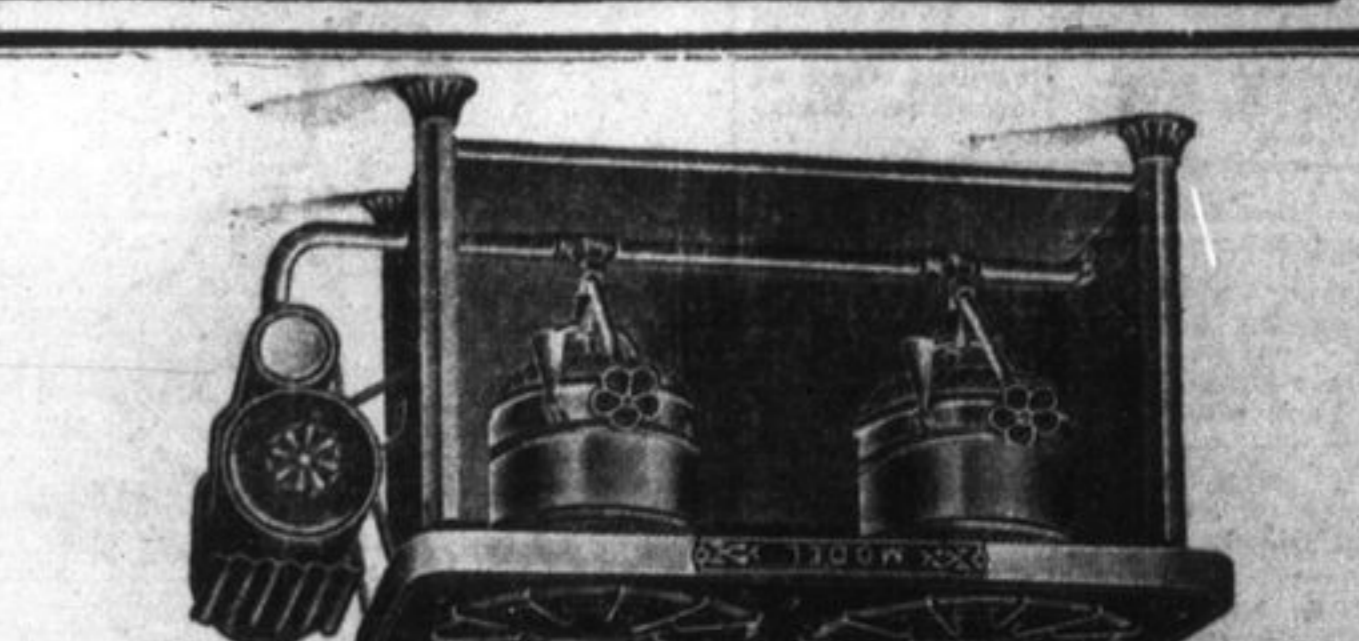
