TALE IS TOLD

Of How Japanese Gained The Victory.

THE BALTIC FLEET

AS A FIGHTING FORCE COMPLETELY DESTROYED.

Thirteen Warships Sunk, Six Captured—Remnant of Rojostevsky's Fleet—Drowning—Nebogoff Captured, With 3,000 Prisoners—Russian Flagship Was Sunk.

Special to the Whig.

London, May 30.—In the great naval battle, fought on Saturday and Sunday, in the Straits of Korea, the Japanese obtained a complete and overwhelming victory. Late advices show that Rojostevsky's fleet was completely shattered. According to the latest information thirteen Russian warships have been sunk, and six captured. Other reports of loss are without confirmation.

Those sent to the bottom are: Battleships Borodino, Imperator Alexander III, coast defence vessel, Oshakoff; armoured cruisers, Vladimir, Monomach, Dmitri, Donskoi, Admiral Togo.

The Admiral Nakhimoff was an armoured cruiser of 5,524 tons displacement, giving her a speed of sixteen knots, and had eight inches of compound armour over her gun positions, carried eight 8-inch guns, ten 6-inch guns, and about twenty smaller rapid fire guns. She had a complement of about 567 officers and men.

The Dmitri Donskoi was an armoured cruiser of 5,200 tons, sheathed, of 7,000 indicated horse power, and had a speed of about sixteen knots. She had an armoured belt six inches thick, and had a complement of about 567 officers and men.

The Vladimir Monomach was a sheathed cruiser of 5,523 tons, and 7,000 indicated horse power. She was completed in 1886, had a belt of compound armour six to ten inches thick, a protected deck of two inches of steel, and carried five 8-inch guns, twelve 6-inch guns, and sixteen quick-firing guns. It is reported also that seventy Japanese torpedo boats dashed into the Russian sinking and disabling battleships and cruisers, but at terrible cost, sixty of them being lost.

Admitted The Worst.

St. Petersburg, May 30.—After waiting vainly all day and evening for news from the scattered remnants of Vice-Admiral Rojostevsky's fleet, the Russian admiral, at midnight, no longer attempted to hold out against the overwhelming evidence that the fleet, on which all hopes were centred, had suffered disaster.
